The Anna Lindh Foundation has launched a short story competition "The Sea of Words" 2015

The Anna Lindh Foundation and the European Institute for the Mediterranean (IEMED) have opened - for the eighth year in a row - an international competition for the short story, entitled "The Sea of Words", that calls for submission of inputs by young authors (between 18 and 30 years old) from 42 countries from the Euro-Mediterranean region.

In the framework of the Year of Sustainable Development, the competition is opened to short stories on sustainable and non-exclusive growth, which increases living standards and benefits to the entire society through the distribution of wealth and protection of cultural and environmental heritage.

The competition is aimed at supporting the creation of stories that help raise awareness about the need for sustainable development, in which the logic of maximum profit replaces the fair distribution of prosperity and respect for the environment.

The short story must not have been published so far, it should not be longer than 2.500 words and may be written in one of the official languages of the countries of the Euro-Mediterranean region.

The deadline for submitting the story is May 31, 2015.
