The Anna Lindh Foundation has launched a short story competition "The Sea of Words" 2017

The Anna Lindh Foundation and the European Institute for the Mediterranean (IEMED) have opened - for the tenth year in a row - an international competition for the short story, entitled "The Sea of Words", that calls for submittion of inputs by young authors (between 18 and 30 years old) from 42 countries from the Euro-Mediterranean region.

"Youth, Stereotypes and Radicalization" is the theme of this competition, aimed at young people, in order to open up a space for them to start dialogue and share their experiences about stereotypes and social influence in relation with this subject.

This initiative has for 10 years fostered cooperation within the Euro-Mediterranean civil societies and opened a space for discussion with citizens, which systematically encourages active participation of society in raising awareness of social problems and exchanging experiences.

The short story must not have been published so far, it should not be longer than 2.500 words and may be written in one of the official languages of the countries of the Euro-Mediterranean region.

The deadline for submitting the story is May 24, 2017.
