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National Foundation for Civil Society Development

Achievements in 2014

Entry into the year 2014, which ensued after the celebration of the first ten years of the activities of the National Foundation for Civil Society Development, was still under the impression of the notable results manifested in almost HRK 300 million invested into 3,969 financial grants to civil society organisations, from civic initiatives, projects, institutional grants to physical and programme infrastructure for the development of civil society, enabling thus the employment of almost 5,000 persons with the inclusion of over 100,000 volunteers engaged in the supported projects and activities of civil society organisations.

The past year of 2014 was marked by continued different forms of support by the National Foundation, however several important achievements deserve special mention. Among them most notably:

- In June 2014, the National Foundation was accredited by the donors of the European Economic Area and Norway Grants as the Operator of the NGO Programme in the Republic of Croatia worth EUR 1.3 million, and already in November of the first year the first call was published for grants to civil society organisations from the Fund, titled "Solidarity and social capital in local communities";
- The activities of the National Foundation as the Implementing Body level 2 for component IV – Human Resources Development, were continued at a high standard, efficiently and professionally through the published calls for proposals and the monitoring of the implementation of contracted projects, and after the beginning of the utilization of EU structural funds through the "mini" ESF and Operational Programme "Efficient Human Resources", the National Foundation, together with the Office for Cooperation with NGOs, successfully implemented two calls in a very short period of time of only 5 months after the publication of the calls, and contracted the implementation of 71 approved projects of civil society organisations;
- By launching development initiatives, at a time of recession and crisis, the National Foundation introduced additional stability and sustainability of civil society organisations through more than HRK 43 million invested into activities for the common good, and continued the trend of supporting employment in civil society organisations. Thus in 2014, owing to the efforts of the National Foundation in supporting civil society organisations, it was made possible to employ a total of 829 persons, specifically 471 women and 358 men, and to involve 7,637 volunteers;
- The utilization of resources from EU funds by civil society organisations was successfully intensified through the management of the Europa Plus Programme that the National Foundation has been implementing for 3 years, which through one-off grants provided for unhindered liquidity and high quality of the implementation of approved projects from EU funds through the model of pre-financing and interim financing. In this way, a little less than HRK 9 million was approved in the form of repayable funds for 69 projects of CSOs from EU funds, of total value of almost EUR 11 million;
- Numerous activities and forms of support implemented by the National Foundation encourage investment into young people, through awards for primary and secondary schools focused on the development of volunteering ("Imprint of the Heart"), as well as through support to CSOs of young people and for young people that use the National Foundation's institutional support. As many as 22 CSOs of young people and for young people receive institutional support which, among other things, also invests into youth employment. In addition, the National Foundation has in its professional team 6 employees under the age of 30, which accounts for 37% of total employees;
- With the aim of investing into the development of participatory democracy in the local communities in 2014, the implementation of 4 projects approved under the call "Together for Better", in towns with a population of up to 30,000, was continued. The approved projects invested into the refurbishment and programme activities of social centres in those towns;
- The Idea for good social engagement award was designed as a way to recognize, promote and support social innovations which are crucial

- to social changes in our country, and which will be the axis of financing through EU structural funds, especially the European Social Fund;
- The successful implementation of development cooperation was continued in the area of Centres of Knowledge for Social Development in the Republic of Croatia, which have an important role, especially after Croatian accession to the EU, due to their work on research and analyses of public policies from different areas of social activity both on the national and on the EU level, transfer of specific knowledge in the Republic of Croatia and other countries (SE Europe, Euro-Mediterranean), development of social potentials and advocacy for positive social change;
- Efficient cooperation was achieved with two ministries in 2014: Ministry of Social Policy and Youth and Ministry of Veterans' Affairs, by introducing new beneficiaries in the institutional support of the National Foundation, in particular CSOs of young people and for young people, unions and CSOs of persons with disability, and CSOs from the Homeland War;
- New forms of development cooperation were introduced through programme grants, namely by investments into the development of philanthropy and foundations within the Programme and the Croatian Foundation Forum "ZaDobro.BIT!", development of capacities of CSOs for rural development, ethical financing, quality assurance system for non-profit organisations and introduction of a methodology for measuring the social impact of CSOs in the Republic of Croatia;
- The Potpora_Pluscomputer programme was successfully connected, and is intended for providers of financial grants to CSOs (ministries and other state administration bodies and public institutions) with the new system Financijskepodrške.hr which brings together user interfaces and functionalities for providers of financial grants, grant beneficiaries (CSOs) and the interested public which can have insight into and search all approved financial grants to CSO projects and programmes in Croatia from all public sources.

In 2014, the National Foundation influenced social change and civil society development in our country through systematic and diverse forms of support: from financing short-term civic actions resolving problems in the community, through projects contributing to the development of social capital and democratisation and development of civil society, strengthening institutional and organisational development of CSOs, enabling links between CSOs, awarding children and youth for volunteering, supporting research projects on civil society development, opening up public space through a specialized portal for civil society and philanthropy, supporting international cooperation and development cooperation provided by CSOs, contributing to the transfer of knowledge and experience from Croatia to the international community, harmonising regional development of civil society in the Republic of Croatia, and creating opportunities for direct impact of CSOs from Croatia on the creation of public policies on the European level through joint projects with European organisations. Partnership programmes with which the National Foundation constructed the entire infrastructure of associated partners were successfully continued, thus affecting the harmonisation of the regional development of civil society with the financial support available on the local and regional level, through the decentralised model of financing civil society development in the Republic of Croatia, and the Civil Society and Local Community Regional Development Programme.

One could say many more things about the achievements of the National Foundation in the previous year, covering in more detail all of the efforts and challenges of 2014, but I will conclude this brief introduction into the Annual Report with the indicative slogan under which the National Foundation operates, namely, It is important to have SUPPORT, and by thanking everyone from whom we received, but also to whom we provided support through our work, because without this mutuality we would not be efficient and successful enough in the implementation of our mission, which is to support civil society development in the Republic of Croatia.

New model for a new decade

Proceeding from Gandhi's wise advice that we should be the change we want to see in the world, in 2014 the National Foundation, after the first ten years of its activities, started deliberating on the need to create preconditions for change, i.e. for new forms of support to organised civil society in the Republic of Croatia.

The Croatian accession to the EU, the arrival of EEA and Norway Grants, and improved procedures of allocating financial grants from public sources brought about new possibilities, but also much greater amounts of resources for the financing of CSO projects and programmes. However, this made even more evident the lately predominant "projectisation" of CSO activities, hence in that regard, the National Foundation, together with the Centres of Knowledge for Social Development in the Republic of Croatia, based on the decision of the National Foundation's Management Board from 2012, started working on creating a new model of support called Thematic Fund "Democratisation and Civil Society Development 2.0". Based on the conducted analysis of the new needs and challenges of civil society development, on 24 May 2014 the National Foundation's Management Board issued a decision on the launch of a thematic fund as a new, innovative model of investing into social development and civil society development, and approved the investment of the initial HRK 15 million of the National Foundation's financial assets into the Thematic Fund for the next three-year period, with the possibility of increasing the fund and extending the investment until 2020 or longer, based on the needs of social development.

With 2015 – the European Year for Development – the National Foundation will turn a new page in the way it awards grants by recognizing needs, but also by introducing a new model enabling support to organised civil society in co-creating and improving the conditions for the activities of dynamic and collaborative open platforms.

The Thematic Fund "Democratisation and Civil Society Development 2.0" introduces support to co-planning, co-decision making, co-management and joint implementation of activities of CSOs, citizens and the interested public involved in open platforms for activities in the following areas:

1. Participatory management of infrastructure, institutions, public goods and other public resources,
2. Expansion of the area of cooperation/activities,
3. Goodsolidary economy,
4. Regional cooperation and cooperation on the European level.

In this way, the National Foundation offers a new model of support "outside of the box" and the already established practices of approving grants to CSOs by individual activities and/or programme areas. The thematic fund is a model complementary to pre-existing forms of support by the National Foundation and contributes to the reactualisation of the basic purpose of its establishment regulated by the Act on the National Foundation for Civil Society Development. This model of support will enable organised civil society in Croatia active in democratisation to act not just from the universal position of the protection of rights, which are most often jeopardized in the case of national minorities, but also from the position of the majority of citizens suffering from the direct consequences of the social and economic crisis.

In this Annual Report on the work of the National Foundation in 2014, through an overview of numerous successes of associated and organised citizens it is visible that many forms of support based on values provide well-being to local communities and the society at large.

The steps forward made in 2014 through new forms of development cooperation in the area of philanthropy and foundations, solidarity, social entrepreneurship, ethical financing, rural development, quality system, measurement of the social impact of CSOs, but also through the creation of a physical infrastructure for better-quality public activities of CSOs through spaces of acting and participating in the future social and cultural centres, are preconditions for timely readiness and finding the answer to new social and economic challenges of development, not just in Croatia, but in Europe and the world at large.

In addition to the above steps, it is a pleasure to also see measurable indicators of change and the impact we achieved through the investment into 486 grants which made it possible to employ a total of 829 persons with multiple effect on the improvement of the quality of life of the citizens of our country, increased level of social capital, promotion and protection of human rights, preservation of the environment, sustainable development, different forms of involvement of excluded groups in the society, building of the society's democratic institutions, development of social entrepreneurship, alleviation of poverty, and renewed recognition of value of empathy and solidarity among people.

We appeal to you to get involved in your own way in the positive changes that will improve social and economic relationships, and we believe that you will find additional inspiration by reading the Annual Report on the work of the National Foundation for 2014. Our contribution to the connections and synergy through different activities focused on the development and vision of achieving active citizenship in a modern, democratic and inclusive society, is presented in this report.

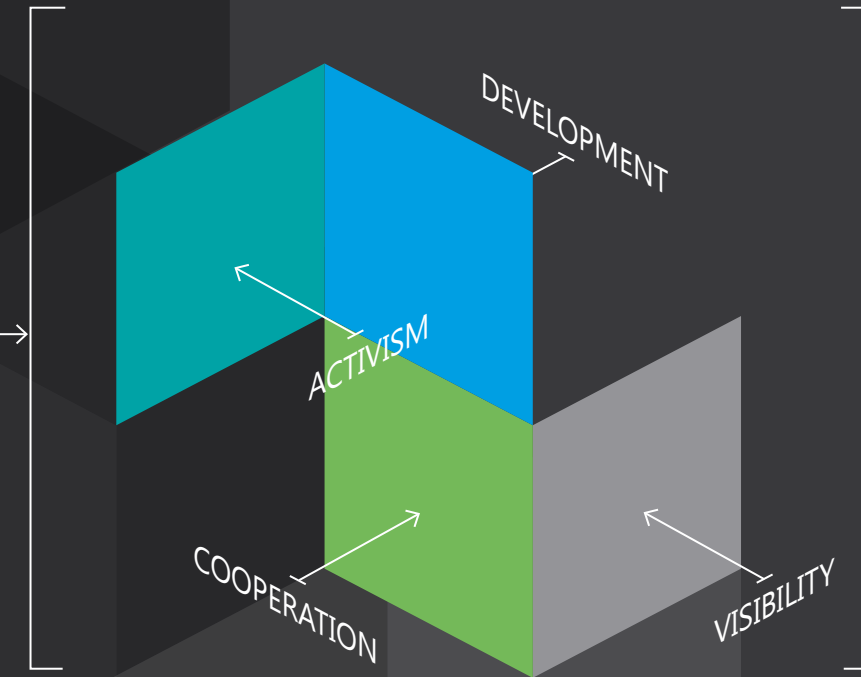
The mission of the National Foundation is to promote and support civil society development in the Republic of Croatia.

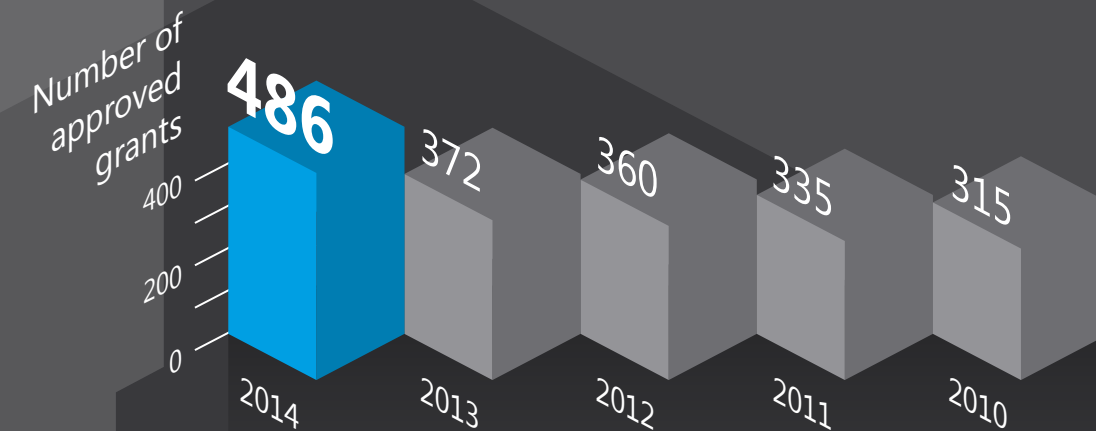

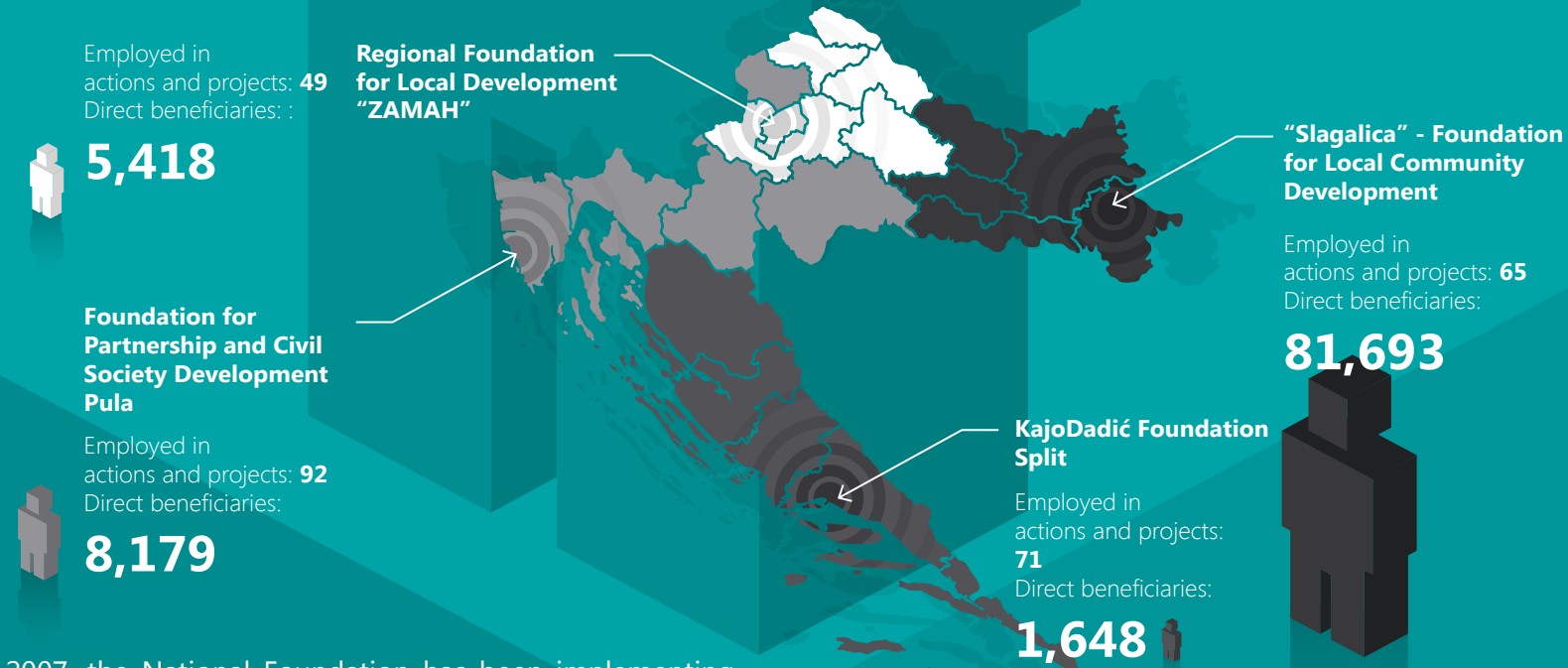

Decentralised model of financing

IMPLEMENTATION:



Since 2007, the National Foundation has been implementing the decentralised model of financing civil society development in the Republic of Croatia in partnership with four regional foundations. The partnership continued in 2014, through the extended decentralised model which, in addition to the calls of the National foundation for Civil Society Development, also includes the extension of the scope of activities and operations of the partner regional foundations by taking over the implementation of calls of certain state administration bodies – grant providers to CSOs.

In 2014, regional foundations published 2 calls for proposals of civic initiatives titled "Our Contribution to the Community", on 15 April and 15 September 2014. All 4 regional foundations approved financial grants in 2014 for a total of 80 civic actions in 20 counties in the Republic of Croatia. In the extended decentralised model, all 4 regional foundations were in 2014 also involved in the implementation of calls of certain state administration bodies: Ministry of Science, Education and Sports, Ministry of Social Policy and Youth, Ministry of Health, and the Office for Combating Narcotic Drug Abuse.

OUR CONTRIBUTION TO THE COMMUNITY and COMMUNITY SOCIAL CAPITAL

Regional Foundation for Local Development "Zamah"-Zagreb

Of the total of 15 initiatives approved in the call of 2013, 9 organisations concluded the implementation in the same year, and 6 of them continued the implementation during 2014. The inhabitants of Zelina, Bjelovar, Glina, Vojnić and Karlovac, with their mutual cooperation and expressed activism showed unity in resolving problems in the community.

In the actions approved in 2014, the inhabitants of north-western Croatia organised themselves and in 10 different communities pointed to the importance of protecting cultural heritage, human rights, preventing violence and including

all members of the community into its life. They also dealt with children's safety and youth problems, and with their own efforts refurbished premises for their joint gatherings.

Social development projects were focused on vulnerable groups in the society, cross-sector cooperation, protection of nature and people and volunteering, and they also made it possible to employ 7 persons, engage 24 volunteers, and include 2,915 direct beneficiaries.

The call supported civic actions related to the protection of children and persons with special needs. As there was a perceived problem of a lack of facilities for socializing and the dying out of traditional values, the actions were aimed at increasing the tourism significance of customs, legends and crafts. The projects involved 73,050 direct beneficiaries.

Almost 2,100 volunteers were involved in projects of learning about tolerance, the development of new knitting skills, cultural and social activities for the purpose of enriching the social life of the community, direct care for persons with disability and animal protection. Activists encouraged the networking of CSOs, citizens and institutions.

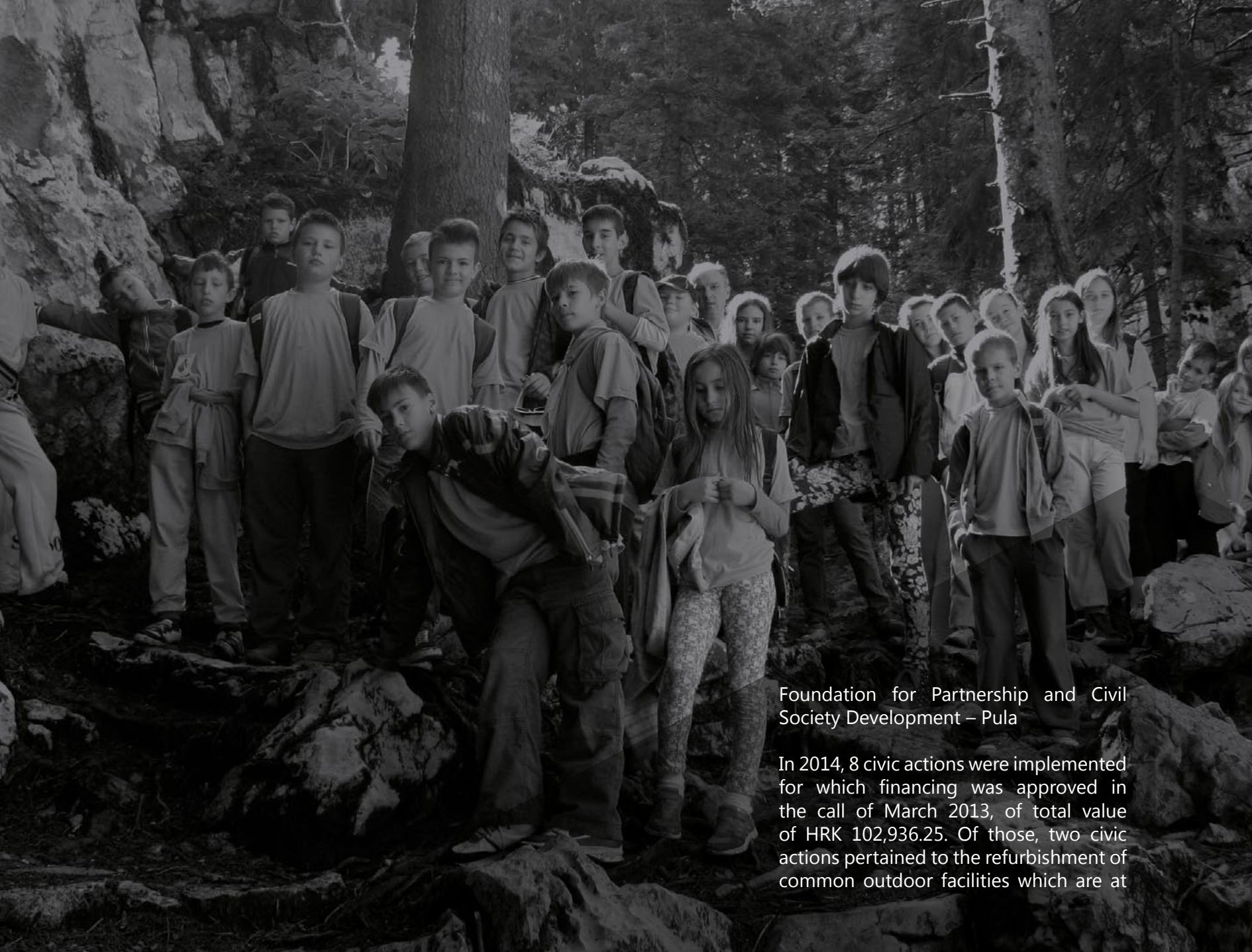
The Dalmatian region thought green and sustainable, hence they reconstructed dry walls and olive orchards, the herders' and mountain path and walkway, and they also created conditions for cycling. Naturally, they also encouraged joint gatherings through play and cultural events. Overall, more than 30,000 indirect beneficiaries benefited from their activism.

The civic actions were focused on children and environmental protection. About 550 volunteers participated in the renovation of a village well, the refurbishment of a kindergarten and the cleaning of the sea bed, walkways and beaches, rivers and forests.

The projects raised awareness of volunteering, social entrepreneurship and sustainable development, transferred long-forgotten skills, developed cross-sector cooperation, camped in order for 45 city children to acquire healthy habits, preserved the natural heritage, but also refurbished facilities for creative activities. A total of 12 persons were employed, and 156 volunteers helped in the implementation of the above actions.



Foundation for Partnership and Civil Society Development – Pula

In 2014, 8 civic actions were implemented for which financing was approved in the call of March 2013, of total value of HRK 102,936.25. Of those, two civic actions pertained to the refurbishment of common outdoor facilities which are at

the disposal of the entire local community, and two actions pertained to organizing the leisure time of young people, one to the increase in civic activism, two to the refurbishment of the environment, while in one action a children's playground was built. The total number of direct beneficiaries of the implemented civic actions was 3,782, with 382 volunteers participating in the implementation.

All of the approved and financed civic actions had an impact on the improvement of the quality of life in the local community: a children's playground was built, a movable stage made of pallets for the city square, and a hanging bowling alley. Efforts were also made to promote tolerance among children and youth, rehabilitated addicts worked on landscaping, additional entertainment was provided for children in a small town. In these civic actions 396 volunteers participated, while the number of direct project beneficiaries was 2,451, and of indirect 16,142.

The project of increasing social capital of the community pertained to improving the quality of life of single-parent families and the networking of stakeholders in the local community, as well as the refurbishment and protection of the environment and increase of civic activism. A total of 30 volunteers participated in the implementation of these projects, and the results affected 1,946 direct and 17,150 indirect beneficiaries.

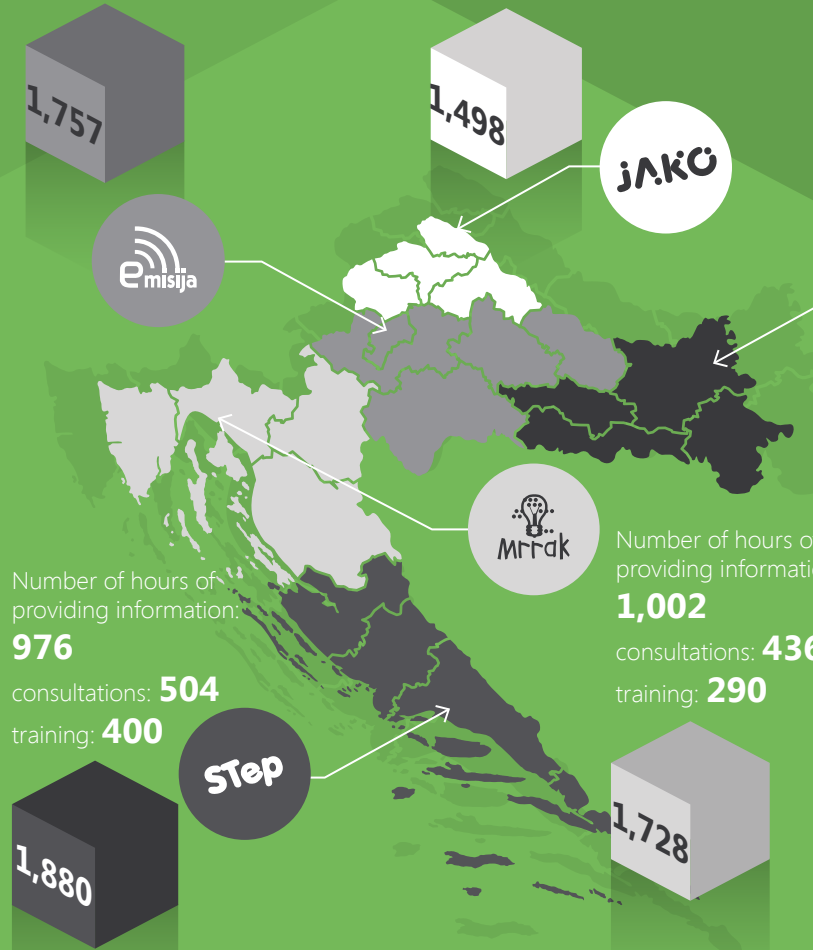
'Community Social Capital' – volunteers in 2014

The year 2013 saw the beginning of the implementation of an enhanced system of support under a new name: Civil Society and Local Community Regional Development in the Republic of Croatia Programme, with the aim of enhancing the infrastructure to harmonise regional development of civil society, develop active citizenship and social capital in the local communities, and prepare to use the resources from EU funds (European Social Fund). The National Foundation successfully implemented the programme in 2014 as well, in cooperation with five partner regional networks – EMISIJA, JAKO, MRRAK, STEP and ŠALTER. In addition to the 5 regional support centres, the programme also involved county associate organisations, thus the entire programme gathered 20 organisations present in every county in the Republic of Croatia. The National Foundation's regional development programme represents the fulfilment of one of its key strategic goals, and also one of the goals of the National Strategy for the Creation

Organisations involved in the implementation of the programme provided support to CSOs through training, consultations and information, and familiarity with local opportunities and needs for the development of CSOs through communication and cooperation with other stakeholders on the local and regional level.

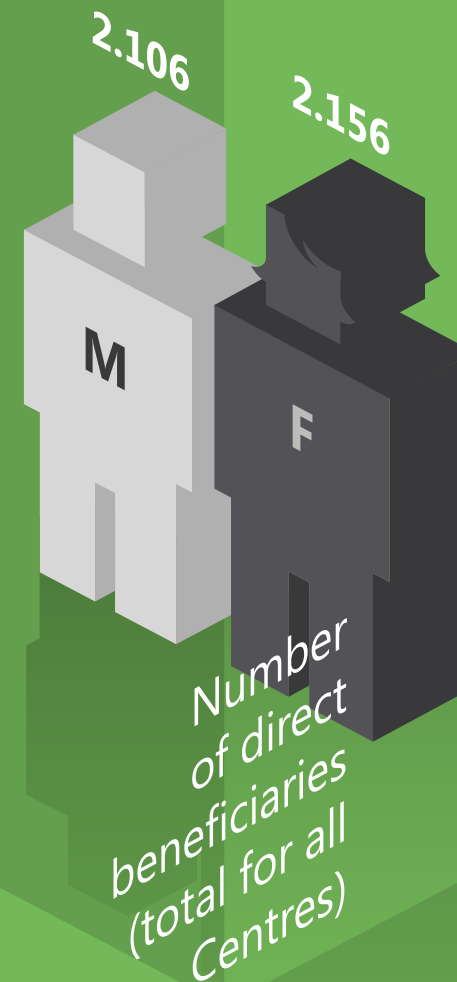
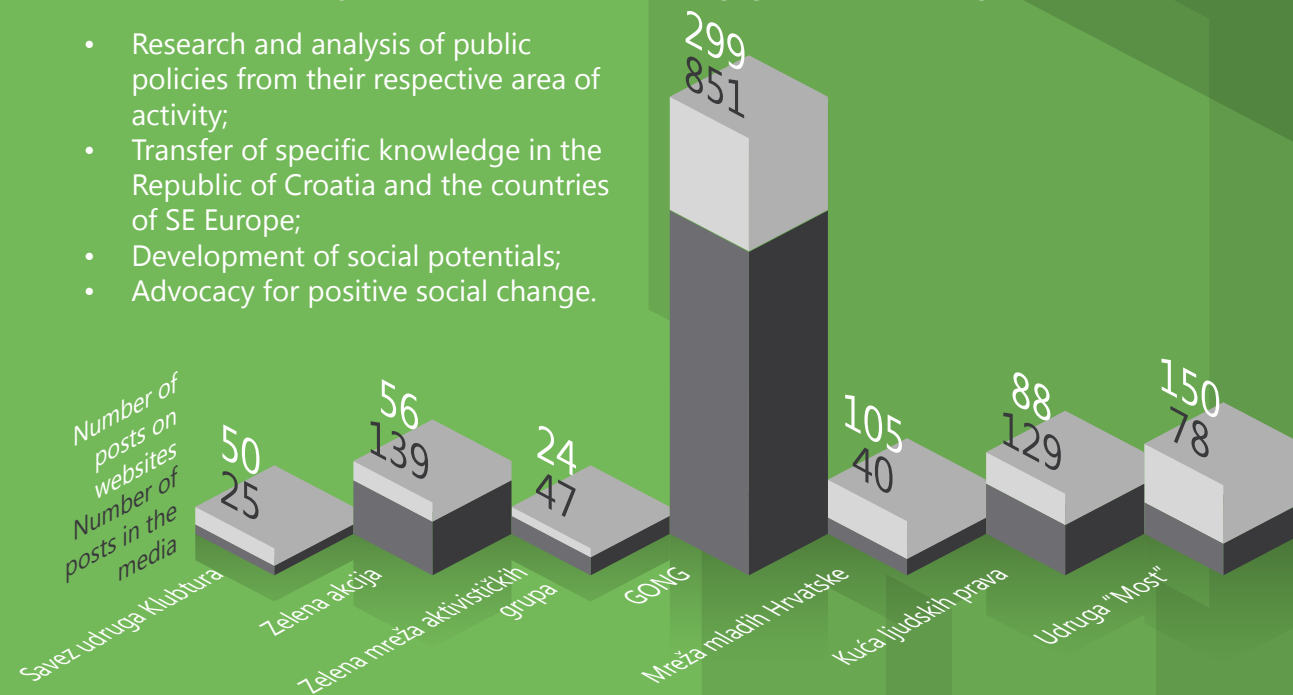


Centres of Knowledge for Social Development

In the development cooperation in the area of Centres of Knowledge for Social Development, the National Foundation includes CSOs with which it has cooperated and/or provided financial support to during the previous one or two 4-year periods of the National Foundation's activities, and which through different forms of evaluation have proven their quality and the profile of their activities through institutional, organisational and programme development, high level of networking in their area of activity and/or involvement of volunteers and citizens in their activities, expertise through the conducted research and solid models of transfer of knowledge in the Republic of Croatia and through international development aid.

Centres of Knowledge for Social Development engage in the following activities:

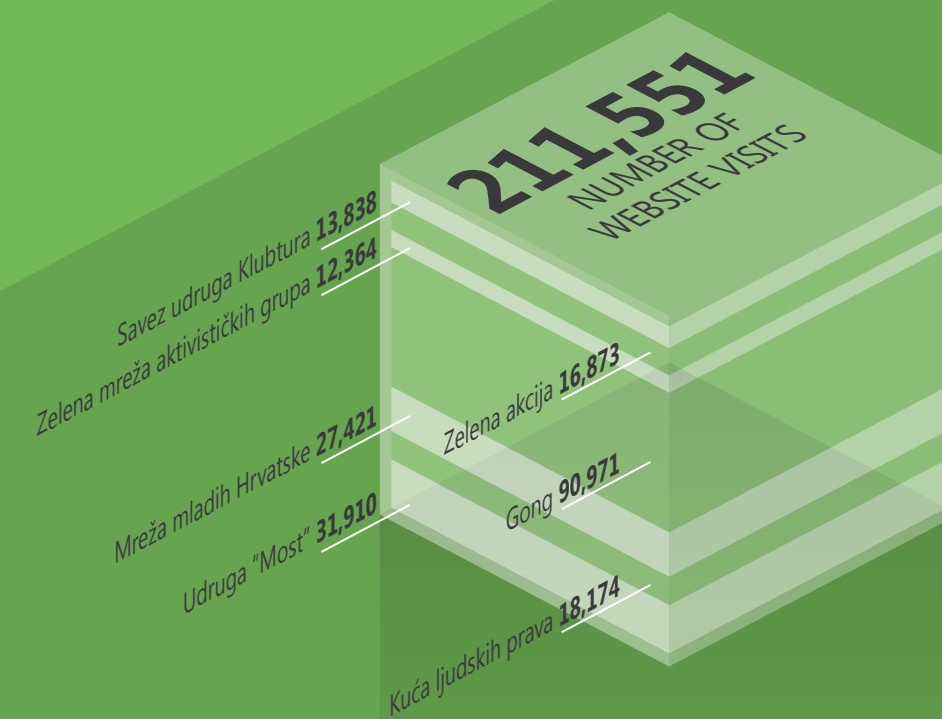
- Research and analysis of public policies from their respective area of activity;
- Transfer of specific knowledge in the Republic of Croatia and the countries of SE Europe;
- Development of social potentials;
- Advocacy for positive social change.



The Centres of Knowledge, together with the National Foundation, worked on preparing the content of the Thematic Fund "Democratisation and Civil Society Development 2.0", which will be launched in 2015.

Implementation of the activities of Centres of Knowledge

In 2014, Centres of Knowledge focused their activities on creating the conditions for an analysis of the state of play in the sector, through the conduct of research, both independently and in cooperation with universities and scientific and research institutions, and by conducting in-depth analyses (impact of financed projects on social change, sustainability of provided services, impact of projects on building CSO capacities, successfulness of established partnerships of the public and non-profit sector etc.), as well as the design and analysis of basic indicators to be used in further programming cycles of financing schemes from the European Social Fund (ESF) or a similar source, as well as measuring the progress of the general development of civil society in the Republic of Croatia.



Catalogue of informal education

As part of the development cooperation in the area of Centres of Knowledge, the National Foundation invested into the maintenance and management of the Catalogue of Informal Education Programmes, which will provide for continuous monitoring of this important segment of the training system and the enhancement of knowledge of all citizens of the Republic of Croatia.

Distant learning

During 2014, the Centres of Knowledge, subsequent to the development of an integrated knowledge base – publications and similar editions – which would provide for a continuous supplementation of the content and would be publicly available online, embarked with the help of the National Foundation on additional training of persons who would, in individual Centres of Knowledge, be in charge of continuous maintenance of the base. Thus 18 representatives of the Centres of Knowledge, throughout April and May

of 2014, attended training organised at the University Computing Centre (SRCE) in Zagreb, and acquired the knowledge and skills needed for professional implementation of the methods of distant learning and/or webinars, related to the content they offer to their beneficiaries.

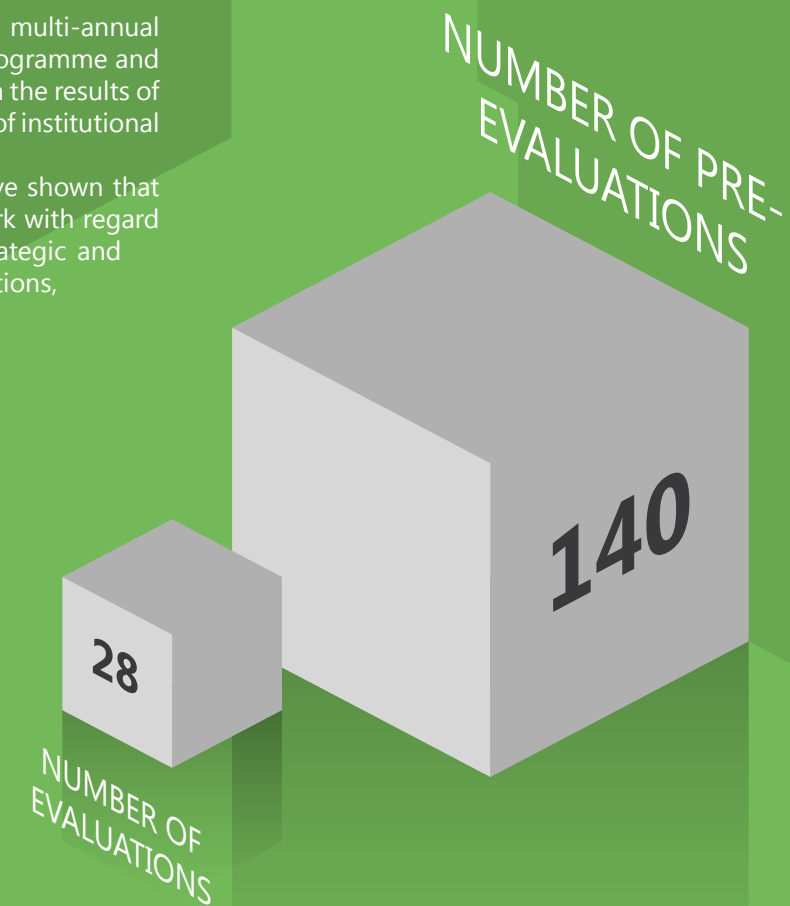
Evaluation and supervision of the implementation of approved grants

During the implementation of approved projects and multi-annual institutional grants, the National Foundation conducts programme and financial evaluation of the grant implementation. Based on the results of the evaluation, the basis for the extension or continuation of institutional grants in the following year is established.

The conducted programme and financial evaluations have shown that the majority of CSOs did not have difficulties in their work with regard to the implementation of activities specified in their strategic and operational plan, as well as transparency of their operations, including the financial part of the implementation of approved grants.

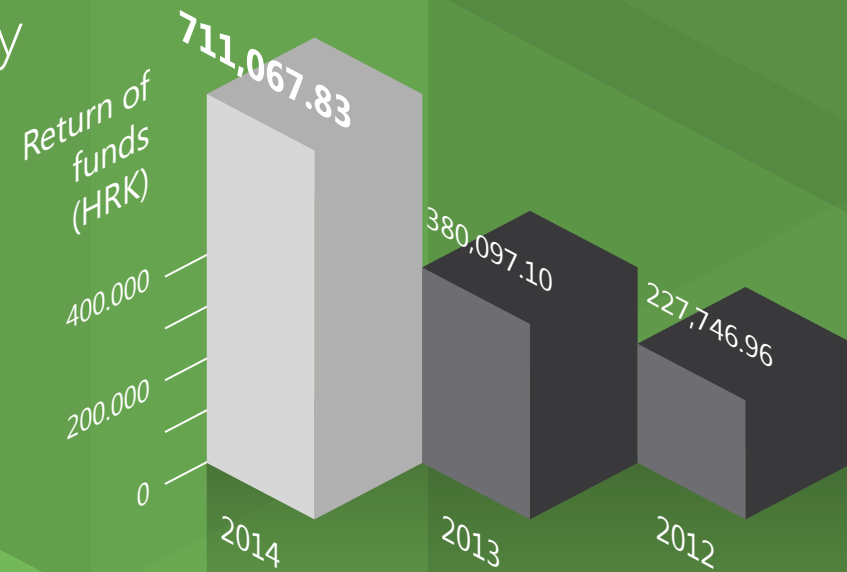
In addition to regular evaluations, in 2014 the National Foundation also conducted 140 programme and financial pre-evaluations in the CSOs that made the short list for the approval of institutional grants, namely: 42 in the area of democratisation and civil society development, 66 unions and CSOs of persons with disability, 19 in CSOs from the Homeland War, and 13 in the CSOs of young people and for young people.

During 2014, several events were attended that were organised by CSOs, schools and cities – beneficiaries of different financial forms of support of the National Foundation.



Grant implementation monitoring

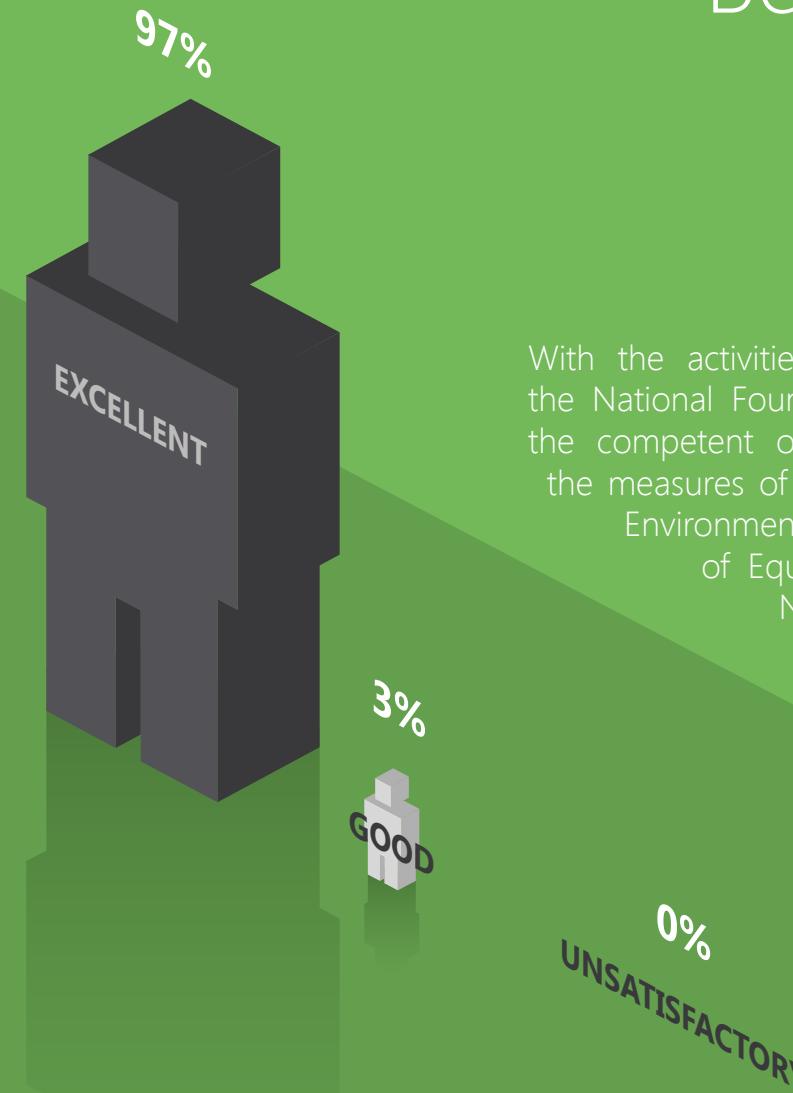
Return of unused funds or funds spent contrary to their purpose



The National Foundation systematically evaluates the programme and financial part of the implementation of approved grants, with the aim of determining the efficiency of investment and the level of changes that occurred in the local community and the society owing to the implementation of the grant, in order to accordingly adapt the priorities and methods of approving financial grants through which it achieves its fundamental purpose and mission. With regard to this, the National Foundation requires the return of funds paid for the implementation of the approved grant if it finds that the funds have been spent contrary to their purpose, which pertains to incompliantly spent funds i.e. funds spent for a purpose different from what was agreed in the specification of the expenses of grant implementation which is an integral part of the agreement/contract, or funds which were not entirely spent on the implementation of the approved grant. The return of unused funds in 2014, in comparison with previous years, points to an increase in new sources of financing, especially from EU funds.

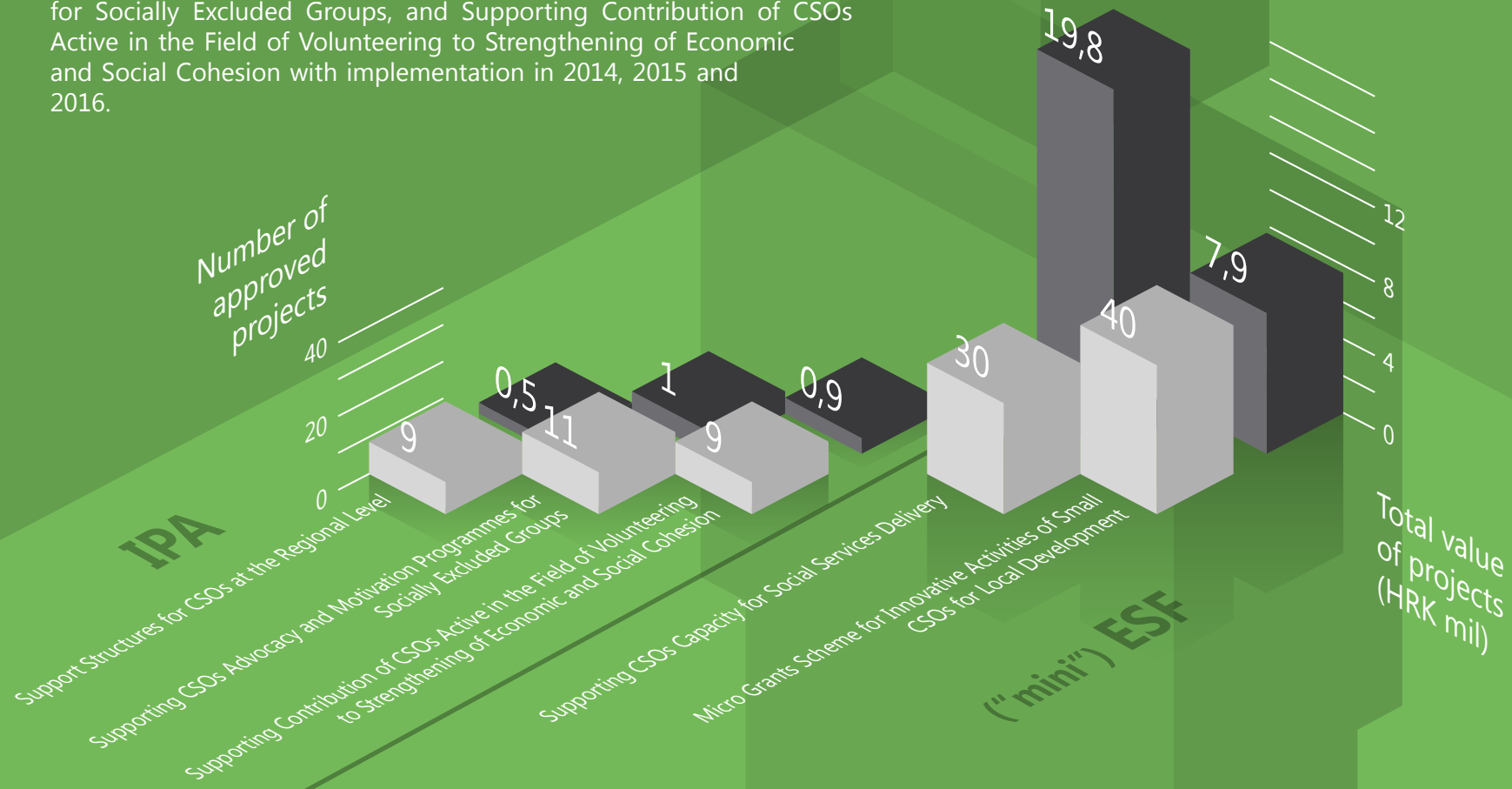
Beneficiary satisfaction with the work of the National Foundation

With the activities and grants approved and implemented in 2014, the National Foundation for Civil Society Development participated as the competent or co-competent authority in the implementation of the measures of the National Strategy for the Creation of an Enabling Environment for Civil Society Development, the National Strategy of Equalisation of Opportunities for Persons with Disability, National Programme for the Protection and Promotion of Human Rights, National Policy for the Promotion of Gender Equality, National Strategy for Social Entrepreneurship in the Republic of Croatia (proposal), Implementation Programme of the National Strategy of Development Cooperation of the Republic of Croatia, and the Action Plan for the implementation of the National Strategy for the Inclusion of the Roma.

As part of the Human Resources Development Operational Programme 2007-2013, Priority Axis 5 –Strengthening the role of civil society for better governance, Measure 5.2 - Strengthening the role of civil society organisations for socio-economic growth and democratic development , three calls were published in line with the terms and rules of eligibility established in the Commission Regulation (EC) no. 718/2007 (IPA Implementing Regulation). In 2013, a call was contracted for Support Structures for CSOs at the Regional Level, and in 2014, the call Supporting CSOs Advocacy and Motivation Programmes for Socially Excluded Groups, and Supporting Contribution of CSOs Active in the Field of Volunteering to Strengthening of Economic and Social Cohesion with implementation in 2014, 2015 and 2016.



With Croatian accession to the EU on 1 July 2013, it became possible to use the European Social Fund for the area of civil society within which in 2014 calls were published and contracted for Supporting CSOs Capacity for Social Services Delivery and Micro Grants Scheme for Innovative Activities of Small CSOs for Local Development, with implementation in 2014, 2015 and 2016.

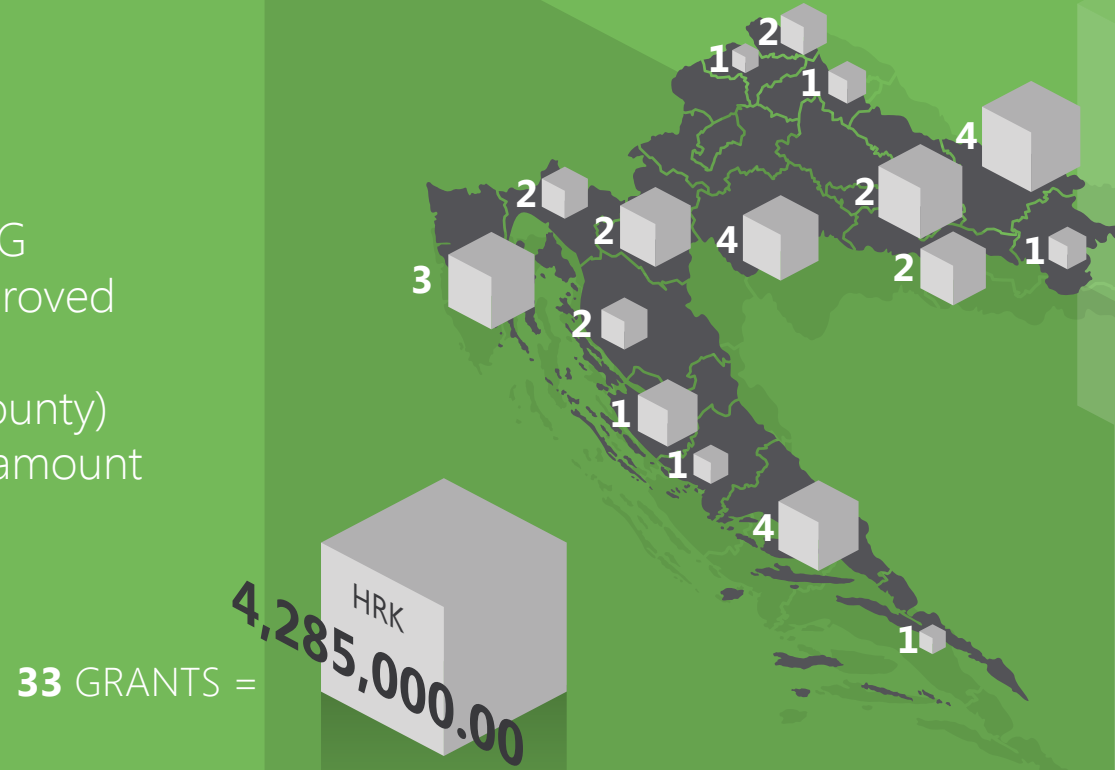

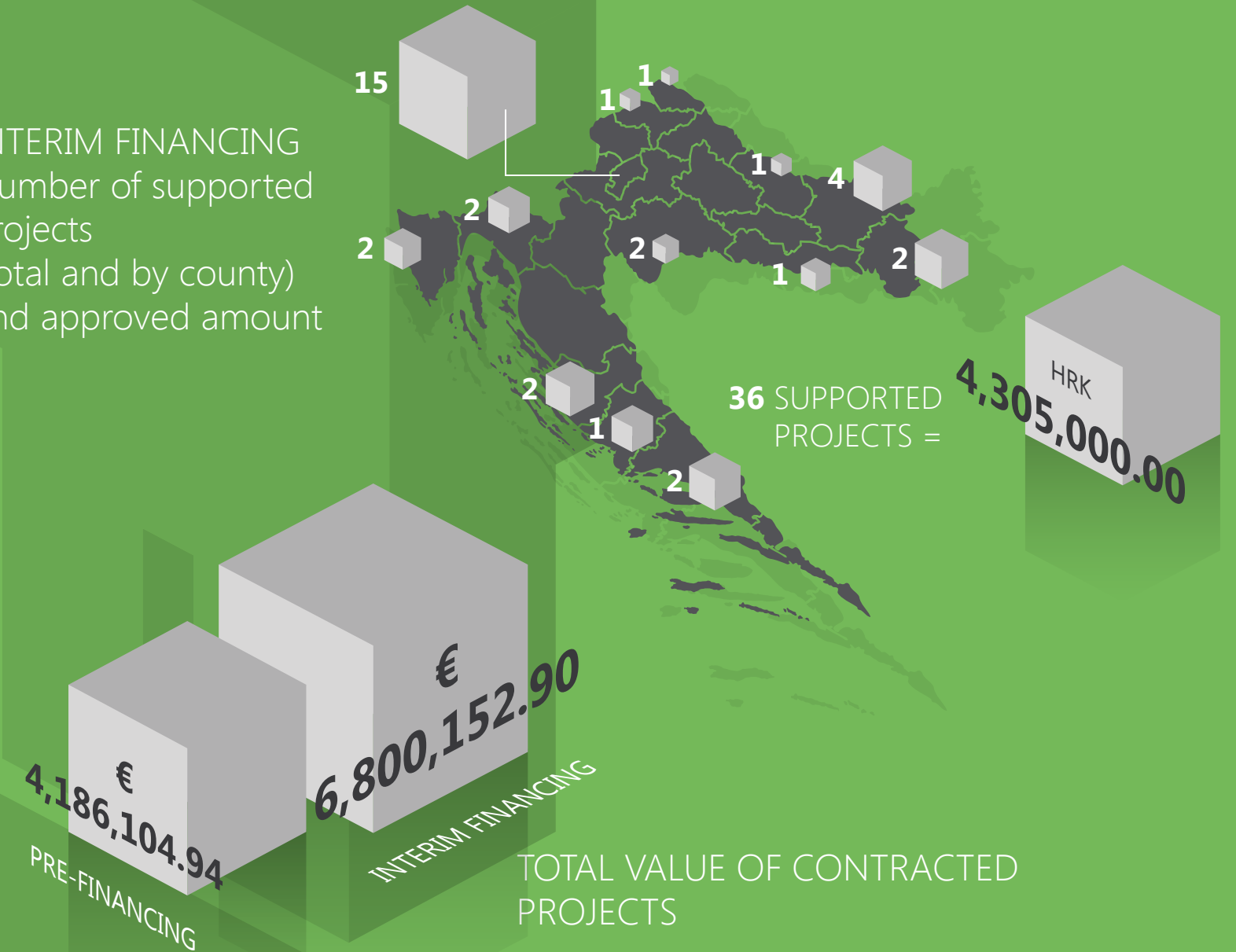
EUROPE plus

With the aim of providing for liquidity and quality of implementation of approved CSO projects financed from EU funds, the National Foundation has been implementing the Europa plus programme since 2013. The programme has two versions, for interim financing and for pre-financing of approved projects, awarded as a one-off form of support with the obligation of returning the funds after the final payment by contracting agencies or implementing bodies, and successfully implemented approved projects from EU funds. In this way, sufficient resources are provided for all major needs of CSOs for this type of support by the National Foundation, which enables the projects contracted from EU funds to be well and efficiently implemented.

EEA and Norwegian financial mechanisms

With Croatian accession to the European Union, it became possible to use funds of the countries of the European Economic Area and the Kingdom of Norway. The Kingdom of Norway, Principality of Liechtenstein and Island have since 1994 financed projects in the Member States of the European Economic Area, in order to reduce the social and economic disparities within the Community, and to strengthen bilateral cooperation between Member States.

In the 2009-2014 financial perspective, the beneficiary countries were allocated a total of EUR 1,789 billion, and the approved projects will be implemented by 2016. A total of 16 beneficiary countries have been included in the areas of environmental protection, climate change, civil society, children and health, social development, cultural heritage, research and scholarship, labour and justice and internal affairs.

The National Foundation for Civil Society Development has been accredited as the implementing body of EEA and Norway Grants in Croatia for the area of civil society, for which the amount of EUR 1.3 million has been allocated for the financing of CSO projects.

The so called NGO Programme in Croatia has the objective of strengthening civil society development and increasing its contribution to social justice, democracy and sustainable development. This is an acknowledgement of the significance of civil society organisations as important stakeholders of a healthy and stable democracy, of the construction of an inclusive society, and of help to vulnerable groups at risk of exclusion, discrimination and inequality.



The National Foundation signed an agreement on the implementation of the Programme with the Financial Mechanisms Office in Brussels in June 2014, and by the end of the year held 3 public events:

- Public consultations – meeting with the interested public in order to ask CSOs about what to include in the programme. More than 100 organisations attended the presentation.
- Official presentation of the Programme – together with the representative of the Norwegian Embassy, Financial Mechanisms Office and the Norwegian Helsinki Committee, the NGO Programme was presented, its specific features and the opportunities it provides. More than 80 representatives of CSOs from all over Croatia attended the presentation.
- Presentation of the first call – within the NGO Programme, the National Foundation published the first call titled 'Solidarity and social capital in local communities', and presented the conditions of the call in order for the interested applicants to be able to prepare for the application as best possible. The presentation could also be followed online, and was attended by more than 80 participants.

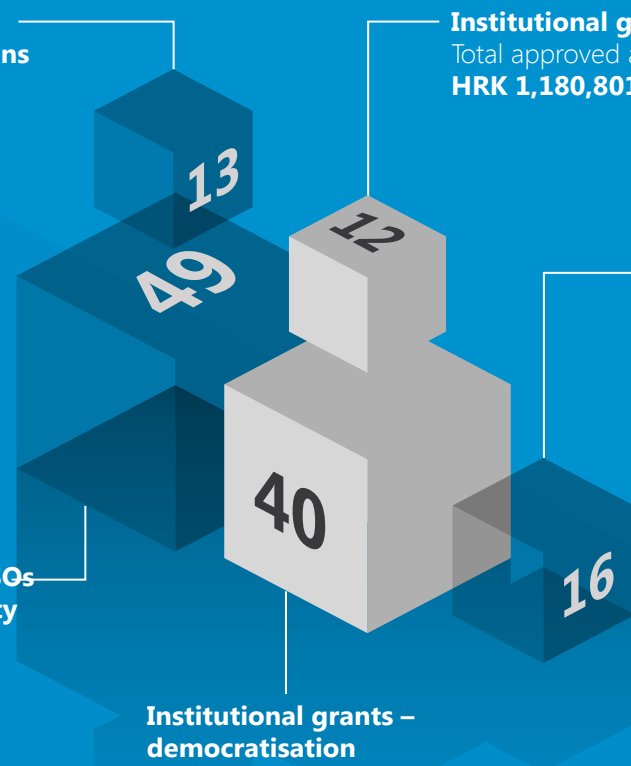

Inclusion of new beneficiaries of institutional grants

After the National Foundation, together with the Ministry of Social Policy and Youth, implemented in 2013 the pilot programme of introducing systematic support to the stabilisation and further organisational and programme development of unions and CSOs of persons with disability, in January 2014 a call was published for institutional grants to unions and CSOs of persons with disability and in this way, for a three-year period, 13 institutional grants were approved for unions of CSOs of persons with disability (in the transitional period until entry into development cooperation), and 49 institutional grants to CSOs of persons with disability acting on the local level.

In January 2014, in cooperation with the Ministry of Veterans' Affairs, the National Foundation published for the first time a call for institutional grants to CSOs from the Homeland War, and thus awarded 16 institutional grants to CSOs from the Homeland War for a three-year period.

On 24 November 2014, training was held for CSOs of persons with disability and CSOs from the Homeland War which were first-time beneficiaries of the said three-year institutional grant, and with regard to this the National Foundation provided to the said beneficiaries training which was attended by representatives of 34 CSOs, 52 of them in total.

In addition, pursuant to the Agreement with the Ministry of Social Policy and Youth, in August 2014 the National Foundation also published a special call for institutional grants to CSOs of young people and for the young people, and this way awarded 12 institutional grants which last for one year in the pilot programme.

Social innovations

Proceeding from the well-known thesis that a problem cannot be solved on the same level on which it was created, through the call for awards for social innovations titled I=d2a (Idea for Good Social Engagement), the National Foundation encouraged CSOs to apply with their ideas for innovative solutions to problems in the social development of the Republic of Croatia. In addition to the awards for the most innovative solutions, initial funds were also secured for the implementation of social innovations, hence in 2014 the activities of 4 awarded CSOs were implemented in the area of specific solution for the registry of landfills, improvement of the quality of life of persons with disability, ecological vegetable growing and launch of a polyvalent social entrepreneurship centre for the employment of young highly educated persons. At the 2014 call, also approved and awarded were 3 new social innovations to be implemented in 2015, in the areas of finding new ways to support prisoners who are mothers, social entrepreneurship of persons with disability and a mobile toy-lending facility in local communities.

Volunteering

Volunteering is one of the fundamental values of civil society, and the inclusion of children and youth in volunteering initiatives and actions is a prerequisite for the development of civic activism and civic education of children and youth. As early as 2006, the National Foundation recognised the importance of developing volunteering among the youngest ones, and has since then been awarding volunteering initiatives of primary school children in the Republic of Croatia, and since 2007 also innovative models of volunteering development in secondary schools.

With the award called "Imprint of the Heart", the National Foundation strives to encourage and award primary and secondary school students, their volunteering initiatives and engagement testifying of their selfless desire to contribute to their local community with their activities, in order to make life in it more pleasant and fulfilled for themselves and for others.

The annual award ceremony for the "Imprint of the Heart" was held on 12 December 2014, at the Mimara Museum, for 10 volunteering initiatives of primary schools and 5 innovative models of volunteering development for secondary schools.

Initiatives from different parts of Croatia were acknowledged, speaking of different needs of local communities for which the answers are provided by children and young people encouraged and supported by their teachers and parents in their voluntary engagement and inclusion in the life of their local community.

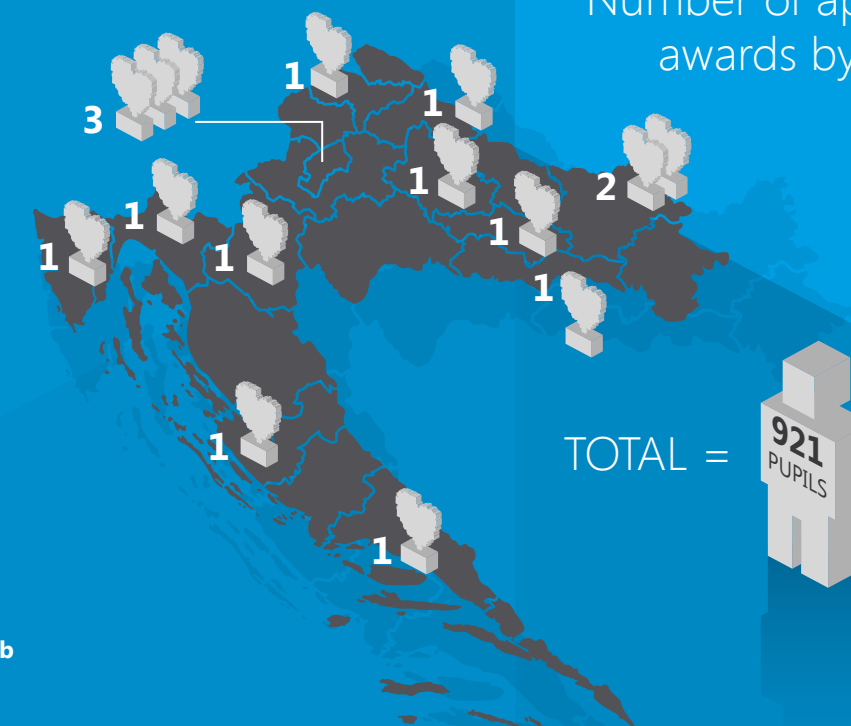

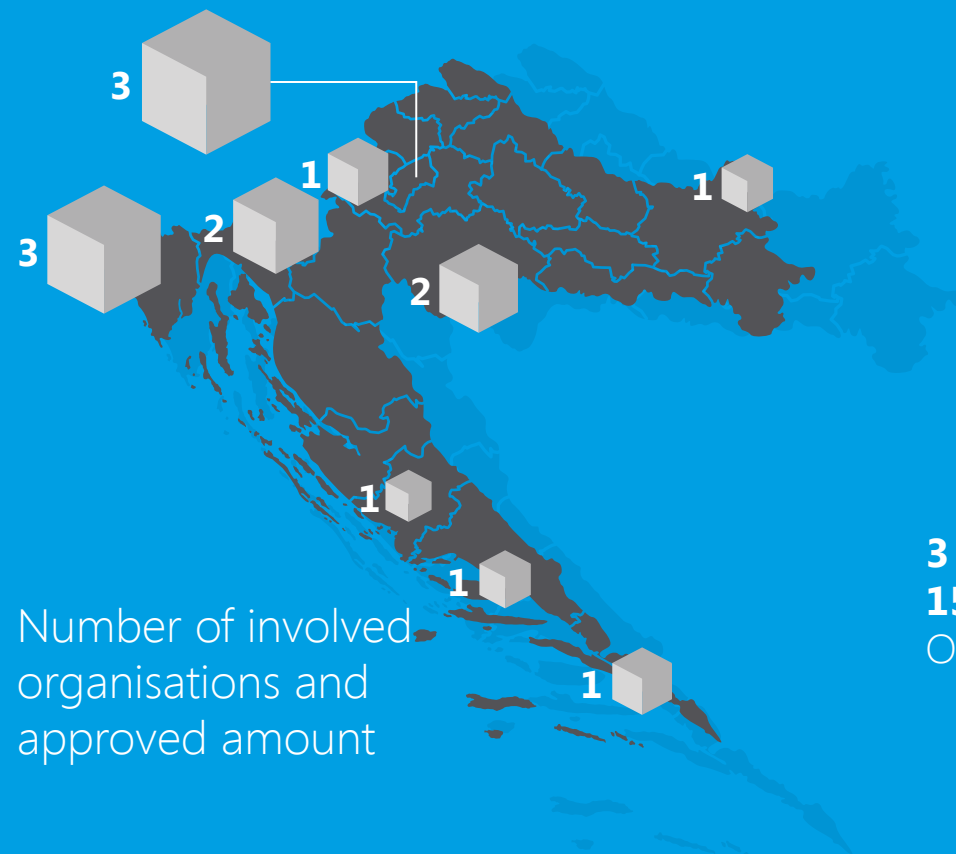

Democratisation and Civil Society Development

The basic objective of the call Democratisation and Civil Society Development is to encourage civil society organisations to connect and act jointly with the aim of achieving positive changes in the society, and to connect 5 (five) civil society organisations from different counties in the Republic of Croatia on common platforms of activities and of the transfer of specific knowledge and skills between CSOs.



In 2014, 5 projects were implemented of different topics and areas of activity, from advocacy for gender equality to the empowerment of CSOs of persons with disability and public advocacy cam-

paigns, and at the call published in 2014 (with implementation in 2015), 3 partnership projects were approved with a total of 15 involved CSOs from the Republic of Croatia and one European network.

Support to ad hoc initiatives

With the aim of reacting to the current needs of civil society development in the Republic of Croatia, also outside the framework provided by calls for proposals, calls for the expression of interest in cooperation, partnerships and awards, the National Foundation approves grants for ad hoc initiatives, provided that those initiatives appear at a time outside the deadlines planned by the calendar of calls for proposals and expressions of interest in cooperation, and that these initiatives:

- initiate the resolution or resolve a relevant and current problem or challenge in civil society development and/or development of democracy in the Republic of Croatia, and
- actively connect a larger number of CSOs and other organisations and institutions participating in the initiative, and
- enable the participation of a larger number of CSO representatives or citizens in direct and indirect activities of the launched initiative, influence the improvement of the status of a larger number of CSOs from several areas of activity, and contribute to the further process of democratisation of the Croatian society

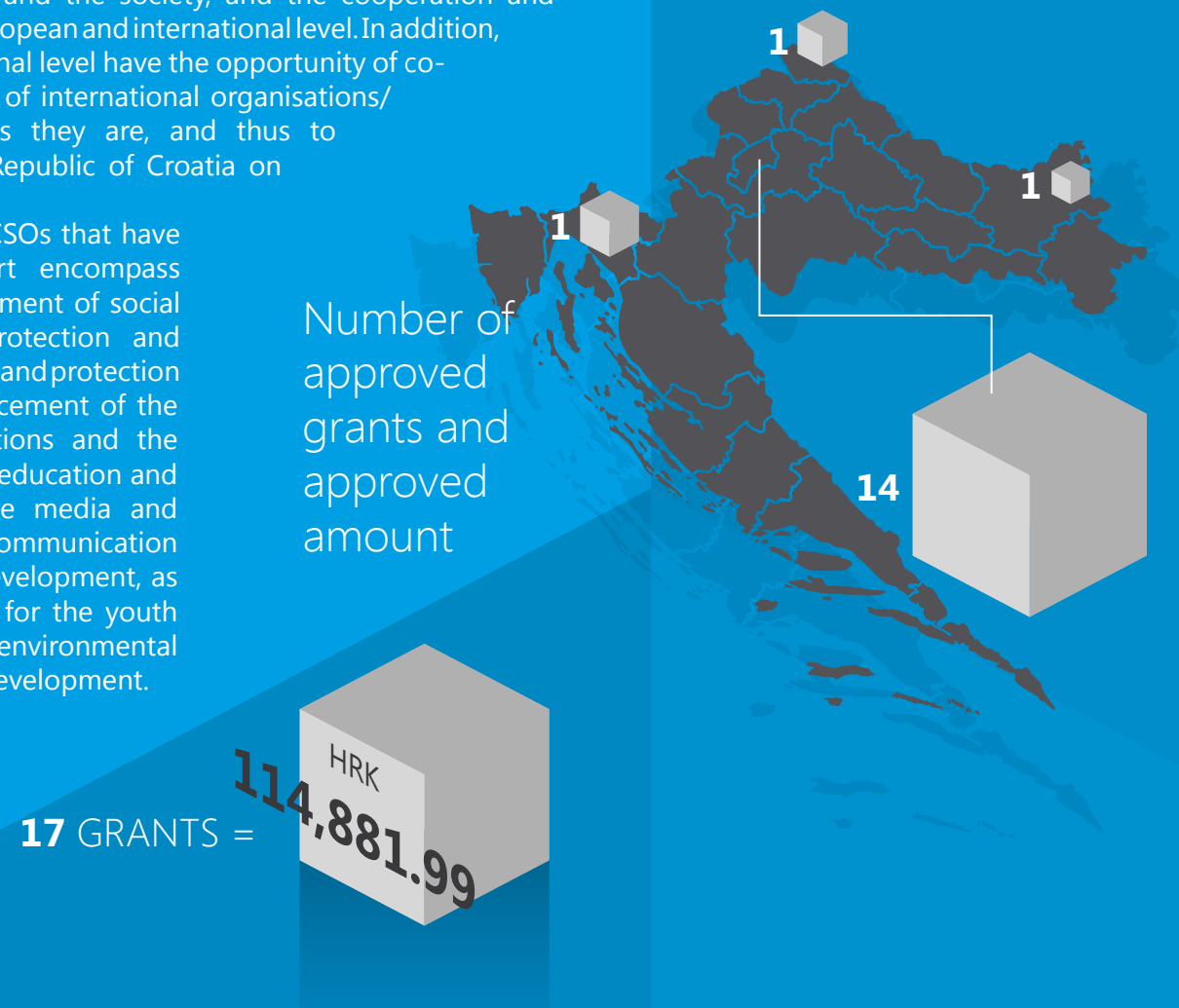
provided that the one-off grant of the National Foundation to those development initiatives ensures a sufficient level of financial security for its implementation.



Knowledge without Borders

The call for the expression of interest titled "Knowledge without Borders" has the objective of providing support to the participation of Croatian CSO representatives in international conferences, or the participation of international experts at conferences organised in the Republic of Croatia by CSOs for the purpose of encouraging the acquisition and exchange of knowledge, skills and experiences needed for active and entrepreneurial activities in the community and the society, and the cooperation and networking of CSOs on the European and international level. In addition, CSOs active on the international level have the opportunity of co-financing travel to meetings of international organisations/institutions whose members they are, and thus to represent and present the Republic of Croatia on the international level.

The areas of activity of the CSOs that have used this form of support encompass social cohesion and development of social entrepreneurship, health protection and family services, the promotion and protection of human rights, and enhancement of the society's democratic institutions and the rule of law, non-institutional education and non-institutional culture, the media and use of information and communication technology in civil society development, as well as the area of working for the youth and the area of nature and environmental protection and sustainable development.



Support to citizens

Croatian accession to the European Union opened up a whole range of new challenges for the citizens of the Republic of Croatia with regard to the understanding of new possibilities in the area of mobility, rights and impact on public policies on the EU level. In this regard, within international cooperation the National Foundation supported the implementation of the project titled Triple A for Citizens: Access to Information, Advice & Active Help. One of the main objectives of the project was to create new or support existing networks of organisations providing free legal aid in the region of SE Europe and Turkey. In Croatia, 2 grants were approved from this international project, and the National Foundation additionally supported 4 projects in order to cover geographically the entire country, and thus laid the foundation for the future networking of organisations, all within the programme of support to citizens of the Republic of Croatia following the accession to the European Union.



The approved projects provided legal aid to citizens on a daily basis, and thus the organisations that received support had over 2,500 direct beneficiaries. In addition to direct assistance, the organisations printed brochures and flyers that were widely distributed in order to provide timely information on free legal aid.



Development through Cooperation

The call titled "Development through Cooperation" encourages the implementation of international development cooperation programmes and the networking and exchange of knowledge and experience between CSOs from the Republic of Croatia with partner organisations in the countries of SE Europe, countries in which Croatia participates in peace-keeping missions, and the countries of the Euro-Mediterranean.

During 2014, five projects were implemented focusing on analysing the way to influence public policy and advocacy methods, cross-sector links and partnerships, and ideas of launching and developing social entrepreneurship, in order to strengthen the social capital in the countries of implementation (Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Macedonia, Serbia and Egypt) for changes in the direction of sustainable development.

At the call published in 2014, 3 new projects were approved in the area of promoting the concept of social development and possibility of employment through social entrepreneurship, complying with the principles of social development, the project of transferring and

applying the model of cooperation between the non-governmental and the government sector and professional organisations on the topics of integral governance, protection and multi-purpose use of the Sava river, in order to connect more strongly all of the countries of the Sava basin, as well as the project of strengthening capacities of civic initiatives and NGOs for social change through the development of trust and cooperation between different actors of social change.

Together for Better

The call titled "Together for Better" supported towns and cities with a population of up to 30,000 which through the approved grants improved and/or established efficient models of including citizens in mapping public needs for the social development of the respective town, and the monitoring of their implementation, all with the aim of improving the quality of life of citizens in the local community. Grants were approved for 4 projects in the towns of Korčula, Kraljevica, Omiš and Pregrada. In addition to the enhancement of the participatory democracy model, the grant also made it possible to refurbish common facilities in the said towns, hence in Omiš and Korčula multi-purpose facilities were refurbished for the activities of the entire community, in Kraljevica the premises of a former bowling alley got a makeover and thus opened the previously hidden possibilities of expanding public space, and in Pregrada the renovation of town premises created the preconditions for the activities of a new community social and cultural centre.



The added value of all these grants arises from the fact that the implementation of the projects directly involved citizens of all 4 towns, through the Citizens' Project Implementation Monitoring Committee, and all of the costs incurred were approved and co-signed together with the mayor.



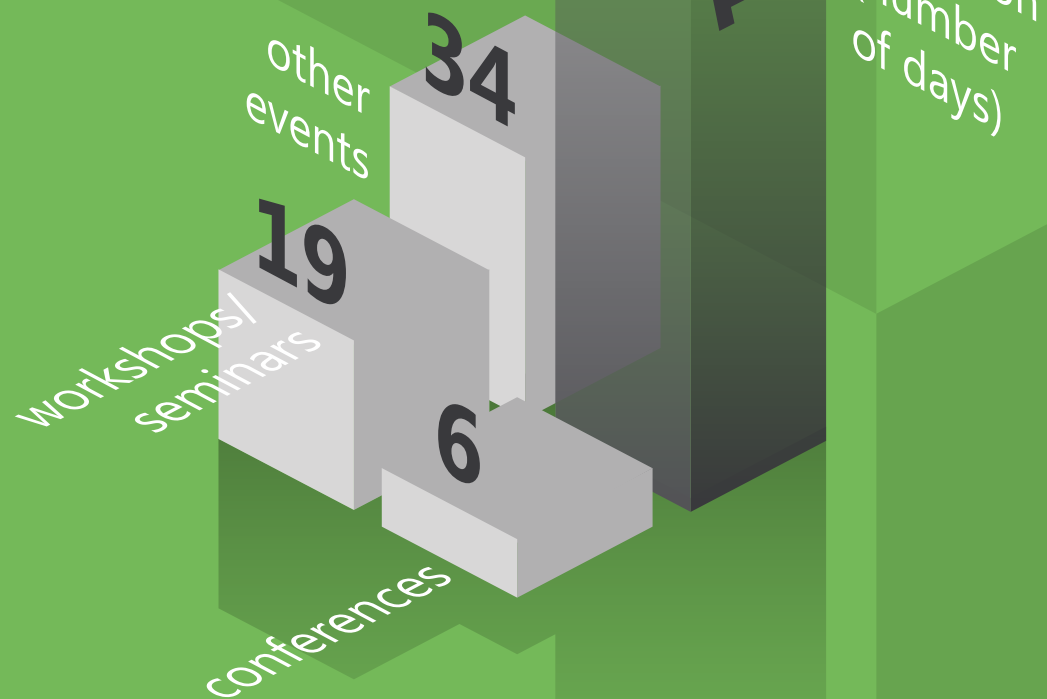
Cross-sector and international cooperation

IMPACT Centre

Since 2006, the National Foundation has been implementing programmes of cross-sector cooperation in the building of the former military barracks in Zadar, which it renovated into IMPACT – European Centre for Cross-sector Partnerships. The programme is implemented in cooperation with numerous national and international partners, including UNDP and ECAS.

The main focus in 2014 was on the creation and implementation of training programmes for the public, profit and non-governmental, non-profit sector with the aim of improving the absorption capacities for EU structural and investment funds on the local and regional level, with emphasis on the less developed areas.

Cooperation in the Euro-Mediterranean

Common interest, culture, history and heritage of the Mediterranean countries represent an abundance of diversities that through the Anna Lindh Euro-Mediterranean Foundation for the Dialogue between Cultures (ALF), based in Alexandria, Egypt, as a framework for multilateral partnership within the Union for the Mediterranean, opened up space for activities for the organised civil society of the countries of the Euro-Mediterranean, through 43 national networks.

The National Foundation is the national coordinator of ALF for the Republic of Croatia through the support of the Croatian Network for Cooperation in the Euro-Mediterranean. The Croatian Network, from its initial 50 members in 2009, when it was established, reached the number of 125 members by the end of 2014, thus becoming one of the fastest growing national networks within the Anna Lindh Foundation.

On 10 and 11 September 2014, the Annual Meeting of the Croatian Network was held at IMPACT Centre in Zadar, and was attended not only by representatives of Network members, but also by guests from national coordination organisations of Egypt, Morocco, and Greece. Thus the discussions of current events and action plans for the following year acquired an international dimension, where the key aspect was the exchange of experiences on issues important for further activities of the national coordinators and other Network members, including the exchange of opinions on the events on the Arabian

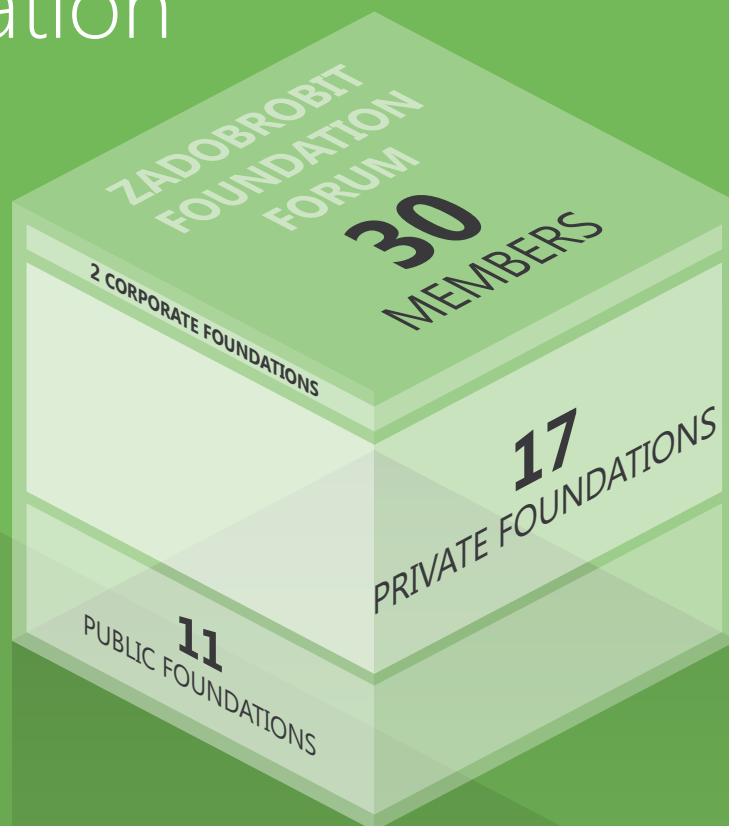
peninsula, deliberation on the possible strategies of using the media as an intermediary in raising visibility and the impact of campaigns, as well as other activities focused on strengthening tolerance and cross-cultural dialogue.

The regular annual meeting of ALF national coordinators was held in October in Naples, which was also an occasion to celebrate the 10th anniversary of the activities of the Anna Lindh Euro-Mediterranean Foundation for the Dialogue between Cultures. The value of the activities of the Croatian Network was confirmed through the specific position that the National Foundation as the national coordinator of the Croatian Network has in the broader context of impact on civil society development in the Republic of Croatia, which enables the Croatian Network to continue its activities in the coming period through different projects and initiatives within the Anna Lindh Foundation, and to continue its efforts in the development of the social, human and cultural dimension of the Euro-Mediterranean partnership, and in the promotion of dialogue between cultures of the Euro-Mediterranean region, as an indispensable part of the Republic of Croatia's international integrations.

Development cooperation

Philanthropy and foundations

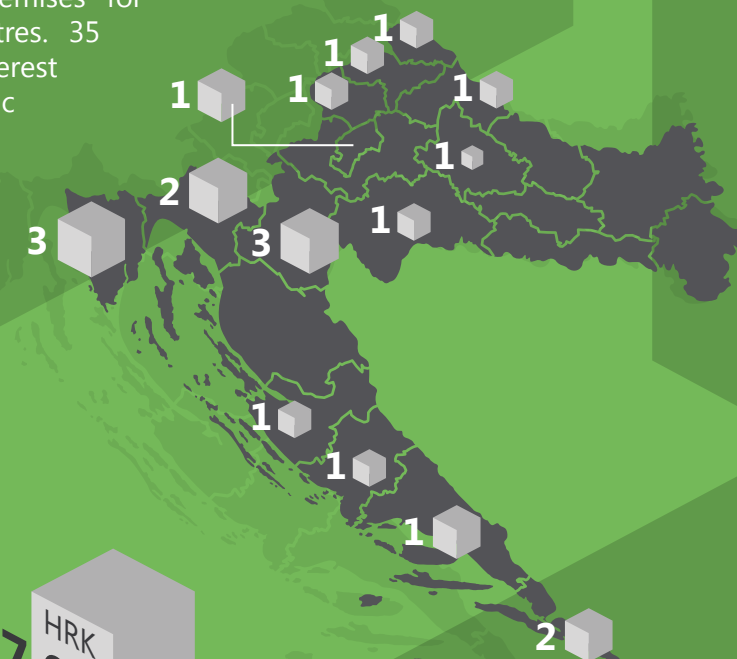
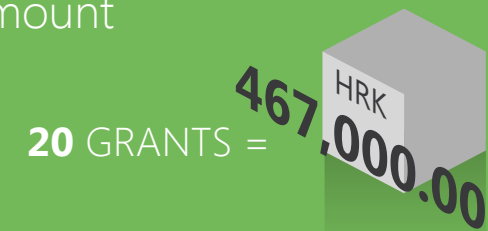
The development of foundations in the Republic of Croatia lags behind that in other EU Member States, hence the National Foundation invested additionally into support to the development of philanthropy and foundations through the activities of the Croatian Foundations Forum "ZaDobro.BIT!" and the establishment of development cooperation with the European Foundation for Philanthropy and Social Development. The said cooperation and "ZaDobro.BIT!" Programme will encourage further development of philanthropy and foundations, build recognisability of foundations in the Republic of Croatia, and raise the level of quality of their activities and the culture of giving for the common good, with plans to also cooperate on the use of the European Philanthropy House in Brussels with the European Foundation Centre, the establishment of the Croatian Philanthropy Centre, development of and support to digital activism, and online donations for the implementation of the philanthropy campaign. The Croatian Foundations Forum "ZaDobro.BIT!" gathers 30 foundations registered in the Republic of Croatia in numerous areas of activity.



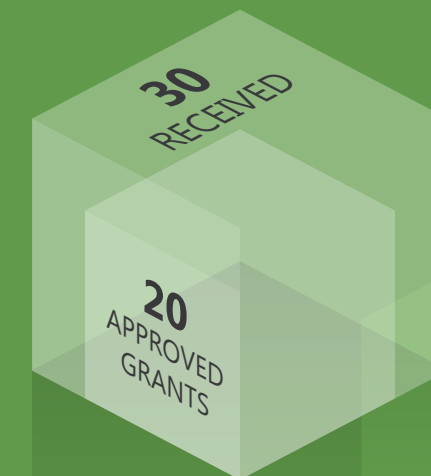
Community (cultural) centres

The pilot programme titled "Areas of Action and Participation" (Prostori (su) djelovanja) encourages cities in the Republic of Croatia to introduce new forms of participatory democracy within the context of the possibilities of social and economic development of the Republic of Croatia following its accession to the European Union. The lack of good quality infrastructure for CSO activities in the local communities was an incentive to the National Foundation to launch the pilot programme "Areas of Action and Participation" in order to find in the synergy of city self-governments and CSOs adequate premises for social and cultural centres. 35 cities expressed their interest in the launched public call for participation

in this programme, and following evaluation grants were approved for 20 cities to prepare a preliminary design and/or sustainability plan for the future social or social and cultural centre. These grants made it possible to implement the preparatory phase which will create preconditions for the application of cities in cooperation with CSOs to targeted calls in the area of creating social and cultural centres in local communities, which will be financed from EU structural funds.



Solidarity 1.0

The consequences of the global economic crisis suggest an increased number of people excluded from the labour market, and of those approaching the poverty line, making the issue of solidarity more important than ever. Recognising those problems and needs, the National Foundation has launched the Pilot – Thematic Fund “Solidarity 1.0”, and based on it concluded in 2014 tripartite agreements in the area of development of good, i.e. solidary economy, with the participation of two Centres of Knowledge for Social Development and two cooperatives in the implementation, which will make it possible with their activities and innovative approach to provide support to groups of solidary exchange, application of simple technologies in the everyday lives of citizens, and inclusion of marginalized groups into social entrepreneurship activities in several target areas in the Republic of Croatia.

Ethical financing

In 2014, 2 development cooperation agreements were concluded through support to the networks of CSOS in the area of rural development in the Republic of Croatia providing assistance in the development of capacities of CSOs – local action groups (LAGs), alignment of rural development policy in the Republic of Croatia with EU requirements and possibilities, analysis of policies on the EU level, programmes, measures, as well as the preparation of beneficiaries from the rural areas to use EU funds, and public advocacy in Croatia and on the EU level.

Rural development

A step forward through development cooperation was also made in recognising the problems of financing through the system of commercial banks in the Republic of Croatia, hence support was provided to the initiative of Cooperatives for Ethical Financing, with the aim of establishing the first Croatian Ethical Bank, by enabling the provision of technical and material conditions for the Cooperative’s unhindered work, as well as helping to promote the idea, i.e. informing the public and institutions on the model of the Ethical Bank, in order to create a climate in which it is even possible to think about launching an ethical bank as a realistic idea which can function in the current economic, political and regulatory environment, and which can offer a financial alternative to individuals and organisations wishing to work in the system of solidary economy.

Quality assurance system for non-profit organisations

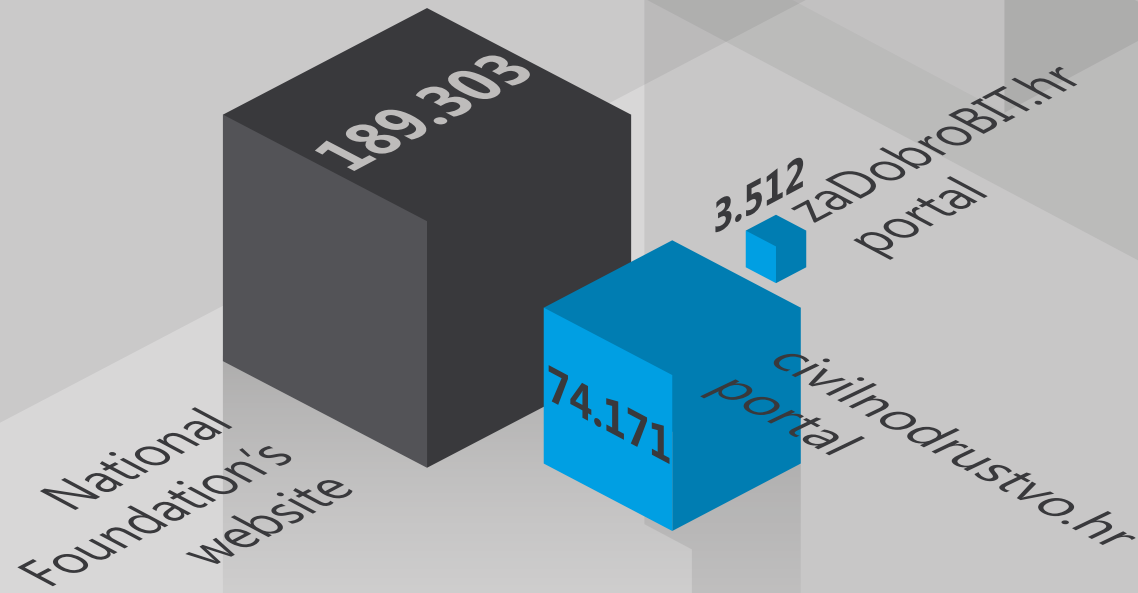
As part of the Civil Society and Local Community Regional Development Programme, the National Foundation embarked on creating a new system of quality assurance for the activities of non-profit organisations. In 2014, work was also done on developing a new system of quality assurance and a handbook for the quality assurance system was drafted. At the same time, the process of accreditation according to the ISO/IEC 17021 standard was commenced, in order to provide for a certification level of the implementation of the new quality system, and since December 2014 tests have been conducted on the new quality management system by CSOs (Centres of Knowledge for Social Development), and a programme was drafted for the training of mentors/consultants, as well as a programme of support to CSOs interested in implementing the new quality assurance system.

Methodology for measuring social impact

The measuring of social impact of CSOs in the Republic of Croatia has imposed itself as a need to consider the increasingly important role of organised civil society in the social and economic development of the Republic of Croatia, in order to obtain clear information on the social, economic and environmental impact of the activities, projects, programmes or policies on the individuals, local communities and the society at large, and also provides indicators to donors on the type of projects and programmes that create greater impact and greater long-term changes with regard to what has been invested. Proof corroborating the achievement of impact is obtained in different ways which are mostly not standardised, although numerous donors, European and national strategies and policies recognise the importance of developing a system of measuring social impact. It is precisely the large number of methods, measurements and tools that points to the need for standardisation and a single method applicable to CSOs in Croatia, which is expected to be developed in 2015.

Visibility

In 2014, the National Foundation continued its permanent activities focused on the provision of timely information to CSOs and the interested public on the activities of the National Foundation, on the preparation and publication of calls, results of calls, organisation of seminars and training programmes, information on the decisions of the Management Board and on the current activities.

Information was provided via the official website (<https://zaklada.civilnodrustvo.hr>) and e-mailing lists, by publishing informative and promotional publications, reports, flyers, professional and technical support to the civilnodrustvo.hr portal. Furthermore, in 2014 the National Foundation proceeded with its multi-annual continuity of providing support to greater visibility of CSOs by informing on their activities within the Republic of Croatia and of activities on the EU level.

The most important means of providing information is the National Foundation's official website, which during 2014 had a further increase in the number of visits, with a monthly average of 189,303 visits.

News on the National Foundation has been transferred by various media in over 1,500 journalistic forms.

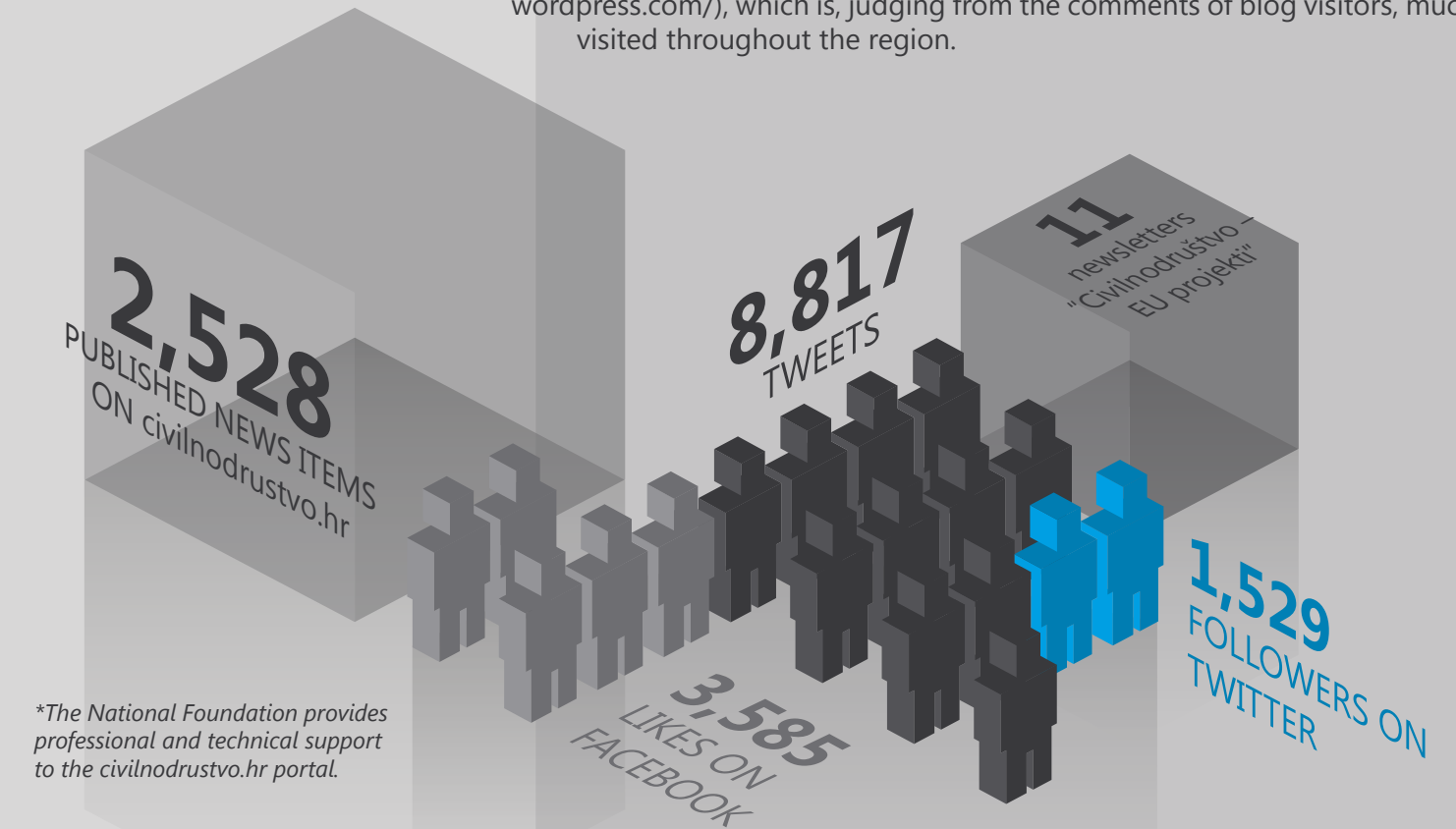
civilnodrustvo.hr portal

In addition to the information on the activities of CSOs in Croatia, the portal also posts information on all individuals and institutions that with their work additionally promote the values of efforts for the common good.

In 2014, about 2,528 articles were published on the portal (interviews, reportages, announcements, news). The portal has its profiles on the social networks Facebook and Twitter, on which it posts everything from the website on a daily basis, on average about 16 posts a day. The portal has 3,585 friends on Facebook and 1,529 followers on Twitter (a total of 8,817 tweets published to date), without paid advertisements.

The portal has also published 11 newsletters "Civilnodruštvo – EU projekti".

In the form of columns, the topics from the portal are also covered and published on the blog Civilka (<https://civilka.wordpress.com/>), which is, judging from the comments of blog visitors, much read and visited throughout the region.

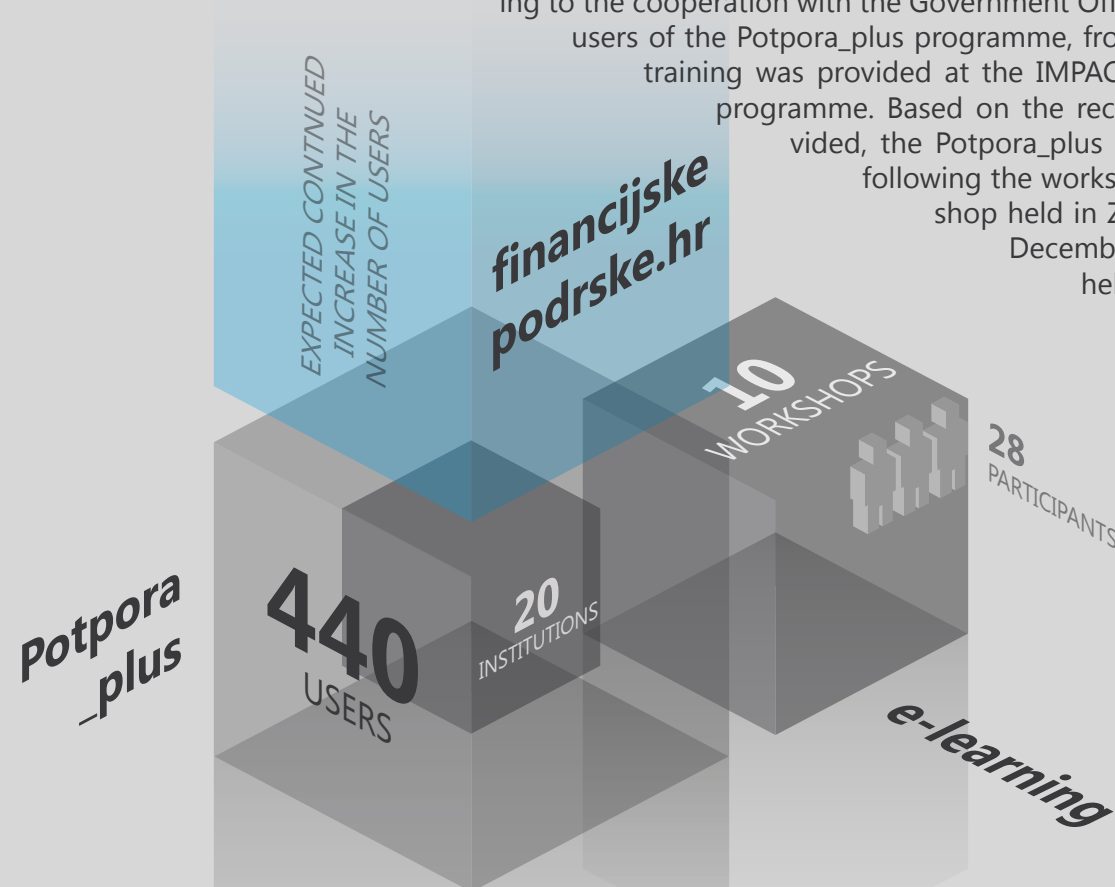
Computer systems, support and training

The National Foundation also achieves efficiency of its activities by constant investments into computer systems, support and training, both of target programme users and of its own employees.

In 2014, the National Foundation continued to upgrade the Potpora_plus computer programme which is intended for donors and grantmakers for the projects and programmes of CSOs and other users.

The Potpora_plus computer programme is integrated into 16 state administration bodies owing to the cooperation with the Government Office for Cooperation with NGOs. For all users of the Potpora_plus programme, from 22 to 24 January 2014 a three-day training was provided at the IMPACT Centre in Zadar on the use of the programme. Based on the recommendations and suggestions provided, the Potpora_plus computer programme was upgraded following the workshop, as well as after the second workshop held in Zagreb on 26 November 2014. During December 2014, the National Foundation also held individual presentation meetings for the upgrades with each individual programme user.

The introduction of the Potpora_plus system made it possible to integrate the information on grants from the state budget, and this provided to the Croatian Government and state administration bodies simpler and safer insight into the spending of that part of the funds.



Financijskepodrske.hr

Financijskepodrske.hr ("Financialgrants.hr") is a system which in one place connects the grantmakers and grant receivers in the Republic of Croatia. This computer system integrates all the information related to the publication of calls, application, results of the calls and implementation of approved grants.

Financijskepodrske.hr is a functional web tool launched in order to make it easier for CSOs to find all of the calls published for them in the Republic of Croatia, and thus to simplify the application process. A reduction in the usual amount of paper that was used in the previous classic applications for calls is made possible by electronic applications through this tool, which results in additional administrative advantages for the applicants and users of Potpora_plus, with benefits for the environment as well.

Financijskepodrske.hr offers:

- to CSOs, the service of a quick search of calls and simpler applications to calls (four step application),
- to users of Potpora_plus, a simpler procedure of processing received applications, and
- to the interested public, the possibility of searching all approved grants to CSO projects and programmes.



Since the beginning of activities, the National Foundation has been using the Linux operating system, based on the open code.
