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SUCCESSFUL AND PRODUCTIVE IN SPITE OF THE CRISIS

We live in a world that is constantly changing. Societies and values change, the climate and the environment change, technology changes, balances change, habits change... However, those changes lead us towards a new model of human existence based on modernization, intelligent approach and sharing. Those changes are at the same time an invitation to all of us to change in working together for a better tomorrow. This Annual Report on the work of the National Foundation for Civil Society Development in 2010 provides a summarized overview of all those minor and major achievements of numerous people in the Republic of Croatia who work on those changes with the aim of further democratizing and developing the Croatian society.

The year 2010 was marked by several important achievements: the “*Za dobro.BIT*” (For well.BEING) programme was launched and will finance the development of philanthropy and the culture of giving for public benefit, we initiated the establishment of the “Europa Plus” guarantee fund for co-financing, pre-financing and interim financing of European projects, and we also held a cycle of seminars on self-financing and social entrepreneurship for civil society organizations.

In 2010, the National Foundation continued to influence social changes and civil society development in our country through the systematic quality and diversity of all its forms of support: from financing short-term civil initiatives dealing with problems in the community, to projects contributing to the democratization and development of civil society, strengthening of the institutional and organizational development of associations, facilitating connections between civil society organizations, awarding children and young people for volunteering and local and regional self-government units for examples of good practice in the development of participatory democracy, supporting research projects on civil society development, opening up space to the public through non-profit media projects, supporting international cooperation and development assistance provided by civil society organizations, contributing to the transfer of knowledge and experience from Croatia to the international community, opening channels of direct influence of civil society organizations from Croatia to the creation of public policies on the European level through the IMPACT office in Brussels, and supporting programmes that introduce a quality system into civil society organizations.

By instigating development initiatives in the time of recession and crisis, the National Foundation has added an additional factor of stability into the sustainability of civil society organizations, through two specialized programmes “*Europa plus*” and “*Za dobro.BIT!*”, and has continued the trend of supporting employment in civil society organizations. Thus, owing to the investments of the National Foundation into support for civil society organizations, it was made possible to employ 584 people, and to involve 950 volunteers.

The National Foundation’s investments into the projects and sustainability of civil society organizations in 2010 had a manifold meaning, one of the most important being that the supported organizations managed to draw four times more resources from the EU and other international funds than the amount invested by the National Foundation. The calculation is very simple: the National Foundation invested 10 million kuna, and the supported organizations attracted additional 6 million euros. This example also testifies to the fact that civil society organizations used almost 100% the resources secured from EU funds.

The National Foundation has not only secured support for the already successful civil society organizations, but has been making long-term investments into civil society through development programmes in order to prepare well for the new financial framework with more development possibilities provided by the use of structural and other EU funds, once the Republic of Croatia becomes its full member. In this respect it is important to maintain the continuity of the implementation of the *Programme of Regional Development and Strengthening of Capacities of Civil Society Organizations on the Local and Regional Level and Decentralized Model of Financing Civil Society Development in the Republic of Croatia* through which the National Foundation has built an entire infrastructure of associated partners with whom it influences the harmonization of the regional development of civil society with adequate financial support available on the local and regional level. This has aided a successful creation of synergy between the social and financial capital in the local community, which through the connections and active contribution of citizens influences the sustainability of the development of local communities and the quality of life.

In 2010, the National Foundation was re-certified for the fourth time for the implementation of a quality management system according to the international ISO 9001:2008 standard in the management of financing CSO projects.

I believe that by reading the Annual Report on the work of the National Foundation in 2010, which is in front of you, you will find the necessary information on all minor and major achievements of numerous people and civil society organizations who work on changes with the aim of further democratizing and developing the Croatian society. It would be wonderful if in the coming decades the success of the society were evaluated not on the basis of the success of those who are successful and powerful, but on the basis of achievements and the position of those who are most vulnerable. And in that we can succeed only if we work: TOGETHER FOR BETTER.

ABOUT THE NATIONAL FOUNDATION

The National Foundation for Civil Society Development was established by the Republic of Croatia by a special Act passed by the Croatian Parliament on 16 October 2003, as a public foundation with the main purpose of promoting and developing civil society in the Republic of Croatia.

The National Foundation was registered on 24 November 2003 with founding assets of HRK 2 million and a constant inflow of funds from a part of the revenues of games of chance and funds from the state budget, with the aim of providing expert and financial support to programmes that promote sustainability of the non-profit sector, cross-sector cooperation, civil initiatives, philanthropy, volunteering, as well as the advancement of democratic institutions in the society.

According to the European and global classification, the National Foundation is a mixed public foundation that combines grant-giving programmes (Grant Giving Foundation) and operational activities in collaboration with other organizations (Operative Foundation).

MISSION

The Mission of the National Foundation is to promote and support civil society development in the Republic of Croatia.

VISION

The Vision of the National Foundation is to create, through its activities, an active citizenship in the development of a modern, democratic and inclusive society in the Republic of Croatia.

OBJECTIVES

The National Foundation has been implementing its activities for the fourth year in a row with the international certificate HRN ISO 9001:2008 for the quality management system in managing the process of financing CSO projects.





ACHIEVE- MENTS IN 2010

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INVESTMENTS INTO THE SUSTAINABILITY OF ASSOCIATIONS

The National Foundation for Civil Society Development has continuously been enhancing the models of support to civil society development in the Republic of Croatia. With the aim of adopting knowledge and skills in the implementation of self-financing activities of associations, in cooperation with the British Council the National Foundation organized a cycle of seminars on self-financing and social entrepreneurship for organizations beneficiaries of the National Foundation's institutional support and for representatives of regional networks – partners in the Programme of Regional Development and Strengthening of Capacities of Civil Society Organizations on the Local and Regional Level.

Social Entrepreneurship

The goal of the interactive cycle of seminars for practitioners and trainers through three two-day seminars on the implementation of programmes of self-financing and development of social entrepreneurship was to raise the level of understanding of the importance of implementing programmes of self-financing and teach those skills to all organizations embarking on projects of self-financing.

Transfer of Knowledge

Furthermore, examples of good practice were presented and possibilities considered for a successful implementation of self-financing programmes in organizations beneficiaries of institutional support. Representatives of regional networks were enabled to acquire knowledge and skills in order to be able to transfer the acquired knowledge as trainers in the Programme of regional development to associations on the local and regional level.

The training was held at IMPACT – European Centre for Cross-Sector Partnership in Zadar, and in the British Cultural Centre in Zagreb.

ZA DOBRO.BIT PROGRAMME

In 2010, the National Foundation launched the "Za dobro.BIT" (For well.BEING) programme which will finance:

- Development of philanthropy and the culture of giving for public benefit,
- Models for self-sustainability of associations,
- Models of financing activities for public benefit,
- Projects of developing cooperation, social capital and participatory democracy in local communities.

The programme will start with a campaign and consultations on efficient forms of support to the above activities so that the first results of the programme are expected in early 2011.



The National Foundation presented the results of its survey among associations – beneficiaries of institutional support on the implementation of self-financing projects, which showed that only 6 associations, out of 41 surveyed, have a model of self-financing for their activities, and 28 have commenced those activities. The reasons why associations do not deal with those activities are: lack of human and financial resources, discouraging environment (laws, taxes) and the gap between the organization's mission and market rules.

“EUROPA PLUS” FUND – ASSISTANCE IN DRAWING EU FUNDS

In 2010, the National Foundation for Civil Society Development initiated the establishment of a guarantee fund “*Europa Plus*”, for the co-financing, pre-financing and interim financing of European projects.

The initiative to establish the “*Europa Plus*” Fund will provide co-financing, pre-financing and interim financing to civil society organizations which have been approved financial support of the European Commission for projects from EU pre-accession funds.

For that purpose and in cooperation with the Government Office of NGOs and the Council for Civil Society Development, the National Foundation has considered the possibility of including the Croatian Bank for Reconstruction and Development in this project in order to provide loans for organizations which have obtained financial resources from the European Commission and signed the agreement, whereby the “*Europa Plus*” Fund would be a guarantee fund for the approval of the said loans with privileged interest rates, for the co-financing, pre-financing, and interim financing of those projects. The implementation of the activities of this programme with the guarantee fund “*Europa Plus*” is expected to commence in 2011.



The aim of the “*Europa Plus*” Fund is to provide support to civil society organizations so they can obtain more easily resources from EU funds and in key moments ensure the liquidity of their activities.

POTPORA_PLUS READY FOR MULTI-USERS



The *Potpora_plus* computer programme is a specialized Croatian programme intended for donors and providers of financial resources to projects and programmes of civil society organizations, which the National Foundation has been developing since 2008.

This Programme helps in the monitoring of all financed projects/programmes from the day of application receipt, opening of applications before a committee, evaluation of applications, entry of all important information related to the monitoring of support, all the way to the final implementation of projects/programmes (report collection and analysis) and evaluation of implementation results.

Although the programme was originally launched for the needs of the National Foundation, through its improvements and updates based on empirical use, it has now been prepared for multi-users. Thus the National Foundation, in cooperation with the Office of NGOs, will put *Potpora_plus* at the disposal and available for use by all state administration bodies and units of local and regional self-government, as well as other institutions and donor organizations in the Republic of Croatia, thereby fulfil the measures from the Anti-corruption Programme of the Croatian Government.

FOR A NETWORKED, CONNECTED AND ACTIVE EUROPEAN CITIZENSHIP

Since its establishment, the National Foundation has been launching and implementing a tender titled *Democratization and Civil Society Development*, supporting projects for the development of democratic citizenship and its participation in the social processes in Croatia and in Europe through projects of advocacy, participation in creating and monitoring public policies, networking, informal education and transfer of knowledge, as well as development of volunteering and social capital through sustainable development of local communities.

In 2010, based on several years of monitoring the implementation of democratization projects and insight into the needs of this area's development, the National Foundation has divided the tender into three topics:

- **Active participation in social processes**

The aim is to encourage associations and foundations to connect and act jointly through the transfer of knowledge and skills, enhancement of methods for raising awareness in the public and inclusion of citizens through public advocacy and informal education and campaigns for a more efficient implementation of public policies and enhancement of the society's democratic institutions and the rule of law.

- **Strengthening through networking**

The aim is to encourage applications of projects of newly established association networks which encourage the strengthening of the network's organizational structure (institutional and human resources), network visibility and recognisability, implementation of activities established by a platform/programme of joint action and strategic planning for the following 3-5 year period of network activity.

- **Investment for local action**

The aim is to encourage applications of association projects on the local level which foster through volunteering engagement the development of active citizenship and social capital in the local community, as well as the development of cross-sector cooperation and local potentials for sustainable development of the local community.

KEEPING ABREAST OF THE TIMES IN INFORMING

In the area of informing the public and civil society organizations, the National Foundation has developed several projects aimed at disseminating information and expertise on its work and the entire field of CSO activities. Thus in 2010, the National Foundation included the e-newspaper "*Civilno društvo*" (Civil Society) into its means of information. In biweekly issues, in a simple, quick and clear manner the target public is informed of current events related to the civil society in Croatia. Thus the electronic newsletter *Civil society.eu*, which had informed the public for the last few years on the civil society in the European Union, was joined by a newspaper with current events from the same field, but this time related to the Republic of Croatia.

Za učenike OŠ Murterski školi na arheološkom će se lokalitetu održati terenska nastava, a djeca će izrađivati i crteže antičke cisterne i antičke ville.

CIVIL SOCIETY ORGANIZATIONS GOOD PRACTICE EXAMPLES

ASSOCIATIONS DRAWING 4 TIMES MORE MONEY FROM THE EU AND INTERNATIONAL FUNDS

For the purpose of timely and quality preparation of Croatia's accession to the European Union, among numerous other activities, in late 2010 the National Foundation conducted a survey among CSOs which were beneficiaries of financial grants in the same year. The survey, i.e. the targeted collection of data pertained to the issues of successfulness of CSOs in drawing resources from EU funds and other international sources, and on the needs of CSOs for further investments into the improvement of skills and knowledge in the area of preparing for project applications in international tenders.

The collected data and information provided an insight into the capacities and skills that the CSOs possess for the raising of funds from EU and other international sources.

Respondent Sample and Structure

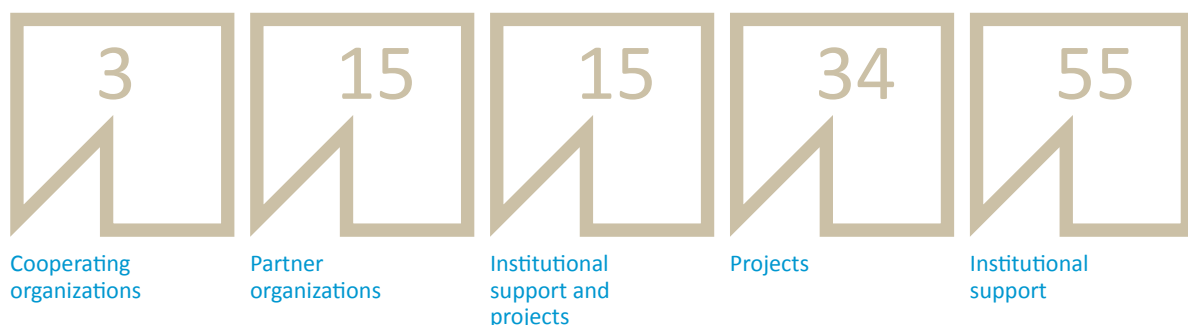
The sample for the collection of data was taken based on the total number of beneficiaries of financial support approved for projects, institutional grants, cooperation and partnership that the National Foundation approved for 2010, and it amounts to 179 civil society organizations.

Out of 179 CSOs which were beneficiaries of the National Foundation's financial support, 122 organizations responded to the survey, i.e. 68% of organizations-beneficiaries of financial support. The structure of respondents according to the type of approved financial support was as follows: 55 beneficiaries of institutional grants, 34 beneficiaries of financial grants for projects, 3 cooperating organizations, 15 partner organizations, 15 beneficiaries of both institutional support and project support.

All of the surveyed civil society organizations specified the number of projects and total amounts of financial support by project which was approved from EU pre-accession funds or Community programmes, or from other international sources. Moreover, for all rejected projects data was collected on the reasons for which the projects were not approved for financing, and the reasons why organizations did not even apply with their projects.

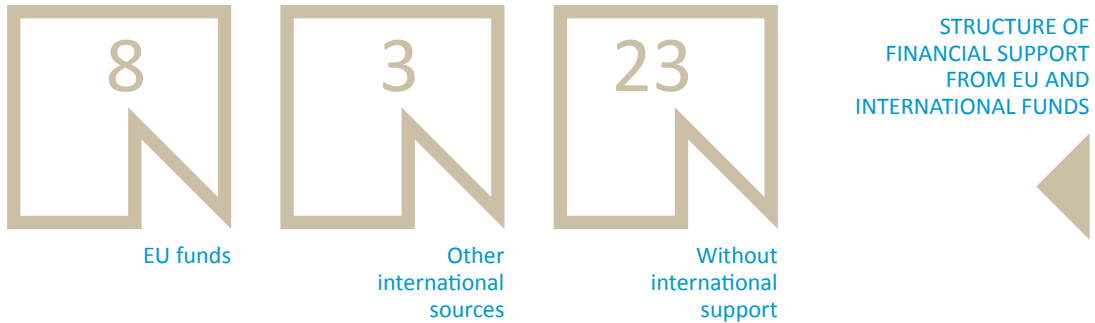

RESPONDENT STRUCTURE BY TYPE OF APPROVED SUPPORT



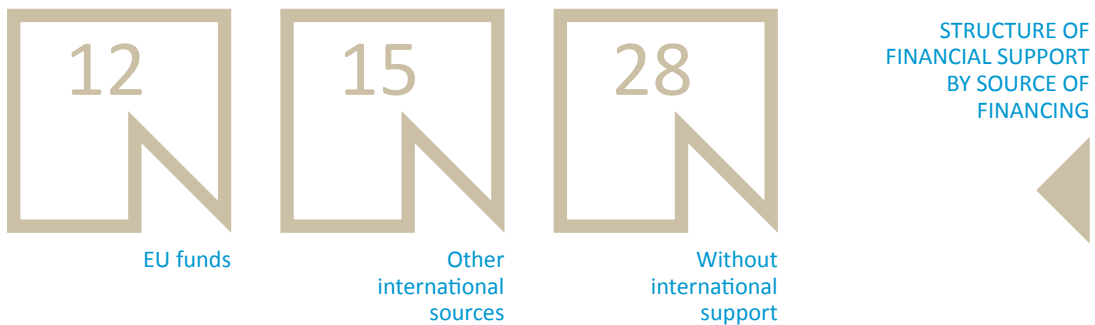
Analysis of Financed Projects

Out of 34 civil society organizations which were beneficiaries of the National Foundation's financial support for the implementation of projects, financial support was obtained by: 8 associations for 8 projects in the amount of EUR 451,287.89 from EU funds, and 3 associations for 6 projects from other international sources in the amount of USD 4,360.00 and HRK 282,685.00.



Institutional Support

Out of 55 civil society organizations which were beneficiaries of the National Foundation's institutional support, for 20 projects of 12 associations the amount drawn from EU funds was EUR 1,982,011.18, while 15 associations obtained support for 27 projects from other international sources in the amount of EUR 110,400.00, USD 153,290.66 and HRK 425,069.50.



Programme Cooperation

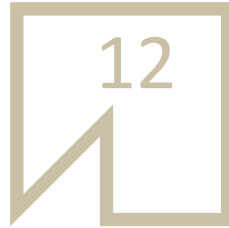
Data on financial support received were collected from all three organizations with which the National Foundation entered into programme cooperation. At the moment of completing the questionnaire, one organization did not yet have the information on the approved amount from EU funds, one did not receive any support, and the third was approved the amount of HRK 111,000.00 from international sources.



Partner Organizations

Out of 16 civil society organizations which are partners of the National Foundation, 15 organizations, i.e. 94% of civil society organizations responded to the survey. Out of the 15 surveyed organizations, according to the data 16 projects by nine CSOs were financed from EU funds in the amount of EUR 1,672,432.23 and HRK 42,300.00. For 11 projects, nine CSOs obtained EUR 27,078.00, USD 142,725.00 and HRK 1,908,400.00 from international sources.

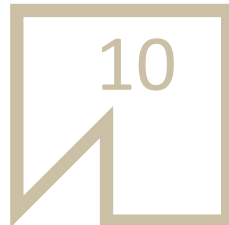

Institutional Support and Projects

The National Foundation has also collected data on financing from 15 organizations beneficiaries of both institutional support and support for project implementation. Data for the 15 surveyed organizations in this group show the following: 6 organizations obtained EUR 863,909.16 from EU funds for 11 approved projects, and 4 organizations obtained EUR 30,000.00 and USD 217,850.00 from other international sources for six projects.

Reasons for Rejection and Non-applying

The collected information and data enabled the National Foundation to gain insight into the reasons for rejecting applied projects and the reasons for which civil society organizations did not even apply for tenders to obtain money from EU funds and other international sources.

REASONS FOR NOT APPLYING TO EU TENDERS:

- Tender dossier too extensive and too demanding,
- Difficulties finding a share for project co-financing, lack of own resources,
- Local self-government not prepared to enter into partnerships,
- Lack of human resources, lack of time to write projects,
- Insufficient knowledge of the English language,
- Projects are limited by tender criteria and the Croatian legislative framework.

REASONS FOR NOT APPROVING SUPPORT:

- Proscribed tender criteria not met,
- Insufficient financial and operative capacity for implementation,
- Projects unprepared, lack of partners in the implementation,
- Not fulfilling the relevancy criteria.

A Small Investment for Great Results

In 2010, for the observed 49 civil society organizations the National Foundation approved the total amount of HRK 10,823,358.00 as an investment into project implementation, but also into the strengthening of capacities and development of skills of those organizations. The total amount those same organizations managed to draw from international funds is: from EU funds, EUR 4,524,062.07, and from other international sources EUR 1,487,955.07. It is an indicator of how civil society organizations are worth investing in.

This several times greater amount of money drawn from foreign funds testifies to the results of investments into civil society, as well as to the potentials that civil society organizations have, which should at the same time be further strengthened and developed.

Upon analysis of the structure of financial support from international sources, it is evident that the majority of support was received by civil society organizations having their seat in the City of Zagreb, 21 of them; they are followed by 7 civil society organizations from the Primorje-Gorski Kotar County, 5 civil society organizations from the Osijek-Baranja County, and 3 civil society organizations from the Split-Dalmatia and Istra Counties each, 2 civil society organizations from the Karlovac, Vukovar-Srijem and Međimurje Counties each, and 1 organization from the Sisak-Moslavina, Lika-Senj, Požega-Slavonija and Šibenik-Knin Counties. Civil society organizations from other counties did not obtain financial resources from international sources.

Za ove će radove udruga potrošiti oko 28.000 kuna - 15.000 osigurala je Nacionalna zaklada za razvoj civilnoga društva, a ostatak su prikupili od ulaznica modne revije koju su organizirali.

Stručni nadzor

- Zahvaljujući volonterima ne moramo plaćati radnike, pa nam je to u najvećoj mjeri smanjilo troškove. Volonteri skidaju beton i ostatke bunkera. Nije lako raditi na kompresoru, pa se izmjenjujemo svakih petnaestak minuta, dodaje.

Inače, radovi se na teškom terenu usred litičice obavljaju uz stručni nadzor konzervatora. U crkvići se nekoć nalazio i kip sv. Nikole, a kameni oltar, koji je dijelom srušen, još se uvijek nalazi ispred ulaza. S lijeve je strane pećine kapelica usječena u stijenu, dok se s desne nalazi kamenica s vodom iznad koje je uklesana godina 1450.

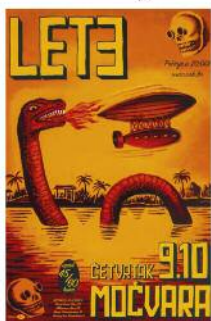

Public Presentation of the Calendar of Tenders and Calls for Expression of Interest in 2010

Pursuant to the Operative Action Plan and the Financial plan for 2010, the National Foundation for Civil Society Development assembled the Calendar of Tenders and Calls for Expression of Interest in 2010, which was presented to civil society organizations in three public presentations held on regional levels: in Osijek, Split and Zagreb.

The public presentation of tenders and calls for expression of interest is an occasion to get acquainted in a timely manner with the improvements related to the system of approving grants of the National Foundation in order to facilitate for civil society organizations the planning and preparation of applications for tenders and calls for expression of interest.

Within the framework of one-time grants for development initiatives on the international level, the National Foundation also launched the programme of co-financing approved projects within the "Europe for citizens" and "Co-operation in the Euro-Mediterranean" programmes and other programmes in line with the annual operative plans of the National Foundation, which has caused a great interest among the representatives of civil society organizations who participated in regional presentations.

Tenders for Allocation of Funds

Within the Programme of Grant Allocation in 2010, four tenders were published: *Democratization and Civil Society Development, Institutional Support for stabilization and/or development of CSOs, Development of Volunteering in Primary and Secondary schools and Participatory Democracy.*

Democratization and civil society development and institutional support to stabilization and/or development of CSOs are financial forms of support to projects of civil society organizations and to the stabilization and/or development of the organization itself. Another form of support is support through awards, given for the development of volunteering which includes a monetary award for the implementation of the awarded initiative, while the award for participatory democracy is a non-monetary award.

In all four tenders in 2010, the National Foundation received a total of 188 applications. Of those, 68 were rejected as they did not meet the stipulated requirements, and 120 were sent for evaluation.

After the evaluation approval was given for: 30 institutional grants, 15 projects, 10 monetary awards, and 3 non-monetary awards. In 2010, grants were also given to 56 associations for which institutional grants had been approved in tenders from 2008 and 2009, so the total number of financial forms of support in 2010 is 111, and 3 non-monetary awards.



The aim of the presentation before the launch of tenders and calls for expression of interest is to acquaint civil society organizations with the procedures, criteria, conditions, and priorities of each public tender and call for cooperation.

- Not all of the legally stipulated parts of the association's financial report were submitted and/or they were submitted on forms which were not stipulated,
 - Insufficient quality of application,
- Objectives and methods were not established clearly enough, nor were the deliverables of the implementation,
- Unrealistically shown expenses in relation to proposed activities.

In 2010, with the aim of improving the system and form of support to civil society organizations, the National Foundation introduced changes in the programme area *Democratization and Civil Society Development* by launching tenders within the said programme area in three topics which contribute to the further democratization and civil society development.

3 TENDER TOPICS:

1. Topic A: Active Participation in Social Processes
2. Topic B: Strengthening of Influence through Networking
3. Topic C: Investment for Local Action

TEMA A: Active Participation in Social Processes

With the part of the *Democratization and Civil Society Development* tender – Topic A: *Active Participation in Social Processes*, the National Foundation encourages associations and foundations in the Republic of Croatia to connect

and act jointly by financing projects on the Croatian and EU level through the transfer of specific knowledge and skills among civil society organizations and different sub-sectors of activity, improvements of methods of raising public awareness and inclusion of citizens through public advocacy, informal education and campaigns for a more efficient implementation of public policies and improvement of the society's democratic institutions and the rule of law.

56 civil society organizations from 19 counties applied for the tender with a total of 12 joint projects, of which 7 applications (31 organizations) did not meet the stipulated tender requirements and 5 were sent to the Evaluation Committee for evaluation. Following the evaluation, 5 joint projects which involved 25 civil society organizations from 14 Croatian counties, obtained financial support for 2011 in the total amount of HRK 1,364,680.00.

TOPIC B: Strengthening of Influence through Networking

The part of the *Democratization and Civil Society Development* tender – Topic B: *Strengthening of Influence through Networking*, helps the National Foundation finance activities of newly established networks of associations fostering the strengthening of the network's organizational structure (institutional and human resources), network visibility and recognisability, implementation of activities established by the joint action platform/programme, and strategic planning for the next 3-5 year period of the network's activities.

At the tender launched in 2010, in the programme area *Democratization and Civil Society Development* – Topic B: *Strengthening of Influence through Networking* in 2011, no grants were approved.

The newly established networks of associations applied with 2 projects, 1 application did not fulfil the stipulated tender criteria, and after evaluation 1 was not recommended for grant allocation.

TOPIC C: Investment for Local Action

Through the part of the *Democratization and Civil Society Development* tender – Topic C: *Investment for Local Action*, the National Foundation financed projects of associations on the local level which through volunteering encourage the development of active citizenship and social capital in the local community, as well as the development of cross-sector cooperation and local potentials for sustainable development of the local community.

For the tender launched in 2010, 46 applications were received, 13 of which did not meet the stipulated tender requirements, hence 33 applications were sent for evaluation to the Evaluation Committee. Following the evaluation, 10 projects from 6 counties in the Republic of Croatia obtained a financial form of support for 2011 in the total amount of HRK 477,472.66.

The aim of the tender is to elevate the level of sustainability of CSOs which contribute to the democratization and development of civil society in the Republic of Croatia through 3-year financial and professional support to stabilization and further organizational and programme development.



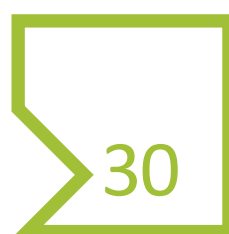
Supported share of the salary for 71 persons

INFORMAL EDUCATION

Informal education projects taught about: non-violent behaviour, advocacy for active participation in community development, improvement of quality of life of young people and persons with special needs, and additional training for the unemployed and low-employability groups.

The tender for the allocation of institutional grants for the stabilization and/or development of CSOs is the only tender of the National Foundation implemented in two parts. The first part of the tender includes the applications of all interested CSOs for institutional support. The second part begins with the selection of the short list of CSOs according to the assessment of the Council for Strategic Investment into Civil Society Development. In the CSOs which make it to the second round, activities and financial aspect are further evaluated, after which the final assessment and a list in the order of priority are made. Out of a total of 90 received applications, the Council for Strategic Investment into Civil Society Development evaluated 49 applications which fulfilled the stipulated tender criteria, and on the basis of the assessment, institutional support was approved for 30 CSOs for stabilization and/or development.

IMPLEMENTATION OF PROJECTS AND INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT IN 2010

Implementation of Democratization and Civil Society Development Projects

Projects for which financial resources of the National Foundation were approved at the 2009 tender, were implemented in 2010, and dealt with the development of civil society through the monitoring and creation of public policies, advocacy, campaigns, informal education for social skills and active citizenship, promotion of human rights and through the development of philanthropy, volunteering and social entrepreneurship. The public was informed of the implemented activities through different media – newspapers, television, radio and websites. The citizens had the possibility of direct contact with the holders of project activities through participation in numerous round tables, public platforms and workshops. Within the financed projects, support was given for the production of a large number of promotional materials, so there were in total about 38 000 flyers printed and distributed, 15 publications (brochures, handbooks, programme books) with the print run of 18 000 copies. In addition, a significant number of posters were put up, 4 TV spots and 5 radio spots were made and broadcast. Furthermore, three advocacy projects dealt with the promotion of sustainable management of the local community resources, and with the strengthening of civic action related to spatial policy.

Civil society development was also aided by projects which encouraged cooperation with the local self-government, empowerment of citizens for participation in the creation and monitoring of public policies, fight against corruption and abuse in the workplace, connecting civil society organizations in the area of non-institutional non-profit culture, creation of an enabling environment for the development of social entrepreneurship and promotion of volunteering among young people. The project of a newly established network of associations has increased the visibility of the only network of associations in the area of prevention of negative health consequences caused to drug abuse.

EVALUATION OF THE NATIONAL FOUNDATION

84% of beneficiaries of financial forms of support evaluated the cooperation with the National Foundation in 2010 as very good, 13% as satisfactory, and one association expressed dissatisfaction with the cooperation with the National Foundation.

Implementation of Multi-annual Institutional Grants

In 2010, the National Foundation also financed obligations it had undertaken to finance multi-annual institutional grants that were approved in tenders launched in 2007, 2008 and 2009. Hence in 2010 it supported 84 associations altogether.

In 84 institutionally supported associations there are 422 employees in total, and the second income compensation was received by 738 persons. The National Foundation financially supports a part in the salary or the entire salary of 209 employees in those associations.

By perusal of the 84 submitted final programme reports of associations on the implementation of institutional grants in 2010, it was established that 74 associations, or 88%, evaluated the cooperation with the National Foundation as very good, a 10 associations, i.e. 12% evaluated is as satisfactory.

Out of 84 institutionally supported associations, 39 have their seat in the city of Zagreb, 9 in the Osijek-Baranja County, 8 in Istra, 7 in the Split-Dalmatia County, 5 in the Primorje-Gorski Kotar County, 4 in the Koprivnica-Križevci County, 3 in the Zagreb County, 2 in the Vukovar-Srijem County, and 1 in the Brod-Posavina, Koprivnica-Križevci, Lika-Senj, Požega-Slavonia, Varaždin, Virovitica-Podravina and Šibenik-Knin Counties each.

Evaluation of Approved Financial Forms of Support

During 2010, the National Foundation conducted 30 regular programme and financial evaluations of the associations' activities, 6 financial evaluations for conditionally approved institutional grants, and 3 financial evaluations for associations to which institutional grant was approved with additional monitoring. During the implementation of approved multi-annual institutional grants, the National Foundation conducts programme and financial evaluation of grant implementation. Based on the results of the conducted evaluation grounds are established for the extension i.e. continuation of financing of institutional grant in the next year. Programme evaluations conducted in all organizations-beneficiaries of institutional grants have shown that the majority of associations did not have difficulties in their work, while deficiencies were observed in 4 associations. With the additional effort of associations in cooperation with the National Foundation, the difficulties in project implementation were successfully eliminated in three associations, and only one association, in spite of the effort and support by the National Foundation, did not manage to find a solution for the abundant programme difficulties, hence the association ceased to work.

DEFICIENCIES

Deficiencies related to financial dealings were observed in 8 associations. The associations eliminated the observed deficiencies within the stipulated period of time, which was established by the submitted documentation or in the re-evaluation conducted by the National Foundation.

Financial evaluations were also conducted in associations which had obtained institutional support in the 2009 tender, provided they correct the observed minor omissions and improve their financial activities. Thus during 2010, 6 financial evaluations were conducted for conditionally approved institutional grants and 3 financial evaluations in associations for whom a grant was approved with the remark that there would be an additional monitoring of financial activities. All other associations removed the observed deficiencies within the stipulated period of time.

Quality Assurance System for Non-profit Organizations – SOKNO

During 2010, together with the Association for Civil Society Development SMART, the National Foundation concluded an agreement on the implementation of workshops and trainings on the introduction of the SOKNO system into associations – beneficiaries of institutional support. The workshop was led by licensed mentors for organizations that are about to introduce the SOKNO system.

The workshops had 48 participants from 32 associations beneficiaries of the National Foundation’s institutional support.

Visibility and recognisability of SOKNO through systematic promotion to a wide circle of stakeholders was achieved by two presentation conferences in Rijeka and Zagreb.

Participating at the conferences were 116 representatives of civil society organizations, local and regional self-government units, state administration bodies and business sector representatives.

SUPPORT THROUGH ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS AND AWARDS

Annual “School – Friend of the Community” Award

On 29 November 2010, the director of the National Foundation, Cvjetana Plavša-Matić and the president of the Management Board, Boris Hajoš, gave out the “School – Friend of the Community” awards to representatives of 5 primary and 5 secondary schools for their contribution to the development of volunteering models and for the promotion of volunteering in their schools.

In accordance with the basic objectives of its activities, since 2006 the National Foundation has been giving out the “School – Friend of the Community” awards for the best volunteering initiatives of primary school pupils in the Republic of Croatia, and since 2007 the same award has been given out for the most innovative models of volunteering development in secondary schools.

The goal of the tender is to encourage children and young people to volunteer in the local community through the development of activism, empathy, solidarity and social skills which will help them recognize and solve (or participate in solving) problems in the local community that they live in.

In 2010, on the basis of the launched tender the National Foundation awarded 5 primary and 5 secondary schools with the “School – Friend of the Community” package and a monetary award in the amount of HRK 10,000.00 for the implementation of the awarded initiatives.

Awarded Primary Schools

- **Kralj Tomislav Primary School from Našice** was awarded for the volunteering initiative “Big Park – a Pearl in the Heart of Našice”, with which they will refurbish an English-type town park, create 4 info-boards on plants and animals, renovate paths and repair the equipment on the children’s playground, while involving a number of fellow citizens, and thus make Našice an even better place to live.
- **“Ivan Kozarac” Primary School from Nijemci** was awarded for the volunteering initiative “Pupils’ Cooperative Bosut” by which through creative extracurricular activities and flower-growing pupils will secure funds to assist pupils and families of lesser means.
- **“Ivan Lacković Croata” Primary School from Kalinovac** was awarded for the volunteering initiative “Waste Use and Utilization” which will gather parents and locals in collecting old paper, electronic waste, plastic bags and waste cooking oil, thereby helping through volunteering and fellowship to preserve and protect the environment in their region.
- **Sučidar Primary School from Split** was awarded for the volunteering initiative “Let’s Volunteer for a Better World” through which pupils will, by involving a number of pupils, teachers and parents, participate in providing assistance to the elderly and the frail, protecting the environment and joining actions organized by the associations of the city of Split.
- **Matija Gubec Primary School from Zagreb** was awarded for the volunteering initiative “A Guide for Small Volunteers”, the aim of which is to encourage volunteering of present and future generations of primary school students through a publication in which they will describe and draw small examples from everyday life which can help the community, and they will also include institutions and local community organizations in the implementation.

Awarded Secondary Schools

- **Bedekovčina Secondary School from Bedekovčina** was awarded for the innovative model of volunteering “Promotion of Volunteering and Education of Younger Pupils” which, in addition to the activities of the Bedex Volunteering Club also includes acquainting students in home-room class with volunteering and raising awareness about the importance of personal participation in the activities that assist persons in need or resolve problems in the community.
- **Petar Preradović Grammar School from Virovitica** was awarded for the innovative model of volunteering titled “Volunteering in the Programmes of the Virovitica-Podravina County Family Centre”, within which students participate in organizing and implementing numerous activities of the said institution in the local community (helping and socializing with children with developmental difficulties, assistance in studying etc.)
- **Hospitality and Food Technology School from Bjelovar** was awarded for the volunteering model “Heart from the Closet”, gathering a volunteer group which, in addition to permanent members, also gathers part-time volunteers and students with developmental difficulties, and undertakes numerous humanitarian activities. For their humanitarian work they also won the Boža Tvrtković Fund award this year.

- **Hospitality School from Osijek**
was awarded for the action “One Hour for Persons in Need” which will be implemented through cooperation of the school students with the wards of the Nursing Home, the Home for the Mentally Ill and Children with Special Needs. The school has a good cooperation with the Volunteering Centre Osijek and is also planning to transfer its experience to other schools in the city and county.
- **I Grammar School from Zagreb**
was awarded for the establishment of the Volunteering Club, whose members have been regularly meeting, designing and implementing actions since 2007, while for the coming period they are planning on increasing their membership and expanding the student initiative in promoting volunteering.

“Together for Better” Award

On 29 November 2010, the director of the National Foundation, Cvjetana Plavša-Matić, and the president of the Management Board, Boris Hajoš, gave out the “Together for Better” awards for participatory democracy to three local and regional self-government units for their contribution to the development of participatory democracy in the Republic of Croatia through cooperation with citizens and civil society organizations.

In line with the general objectives of the activities of the National Foundation for Civil Society Development, and as part of the activities foreseen by the Operative Implementation Plan of the National Strategy, motivated by the effort to support examples of good practice of inclusive local communities which contribute to raising the quality of life of citizens in those communities, the National Foundation publishes the tender for the “Together for Better” awards.

Local and regional self-government units can apply to the tender with examples of good practice and their achievements in the development of participatory democracy, through the enhancement of systematic inclusion of citizens in establishing public need priorities in the community and their involvement in decision-making processes in the local and regional self-government, as well as cooperation with citizens and civil society organizations through the improvement of services for citizens and readiness to create and implement a local cooperation programme (or charter of cooperation) with civil society organizations.

In 2010, 12 local and regional self-government units applied to the tender for the “Together for Better” awards. One of them did not fulfil the stipulated tender criteria, and 11 were sent for further evaluation.

The “Together for Better” award acknowledges counties, cities and municipalities which have distinguished themselves in the development of participatory democracy, involvement of citizens in the work of the local or regional self-government, and public and responsible financing of civil society projects and programmes.

Awarded Local and Regional Self-government Units

- Municipality of Šolta

signed a Charter of Cooperation through the establishment of the Forum of Associations of the Island of Šolta, with the aim of mutual networking and helping associations for the purpose of achieving joint goals, with the local self-government acting as partner. The Forum has its coordinator who is an employee of the Culture and Information Centre. They also instigated the publishing of an informative paper and the creation of a website, and the regular Forum meetings are always attended by the head of municipality, deputy head of municipality and director of the Tourist Community. Also participating in the development of the Municipality are associations, local committees, Youth and Citizens Council, and they jointly designed the project titled *Šolta in the Palm of Your Hand*, promoting the island of Šolta as a unique tourist destination with the offer of autochthonous Šolta products and the island’s traditional culture.

- Town of Sisak

has had a signed Charter of Cooperation since 30 December 2008, which allows for the establishment of the Civil Society Development Council as a

working body composed of association members, citizens and town representatives. With the aim of promoting the values of volunteering, the Town of Sisak has established the Youth Council, Pensioners Committee, and every year it gives out the *Volunteers of the Year* award for the promotion of values of volunteering. The town has signed the agreement on lease financing for the Safe House, and it also supports day care for pensioners.



- **Međimurje County**

has a clearly established procedure of selecting CSO projects and an efficient system of reporting to grant beneficiaries on the results of financed projects. Special care is taken in promoting good practice of development partnerships on the local and regional level. The county is also active in sensitizing stakeholders to the need of cooperation and partnership with civil society organizations. They also encourage the involvement of citizens in the making of decisions of public interest. Since 2004, the County has been involved in the *Healthy County* programme. Cooperation with associations was also established in the drafting of the *Regional Operational Programme of the Međimurje County for the 2006-2013 period*.

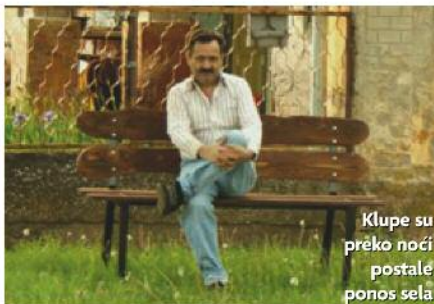
Selo sa 100 klupa

IV.B.

INITIAL COOPERATION

The National Foundation implements its operational activities by developing and contracting initial cooperation with other organizations through calls for expression of interest.

Initial cooperation with the National Foundation in project implementation implies cooperation both with regard to content and to the operative aspect, by including and providing timely information to the National Foundation on all activities from the beginning of project implementation to the evaluation of its impacts. The said cooperation includes the preparation of project implementation (arranging cooperation), monthly monitoring of progress achieved in project implementation, consulting on necessary amendments, measuring and evaluation of results and consulting on further activities in the projects. In this way, by using the resources of the civil society organizations themselves and their strengthening, the National Foundation achieves results in areas of importance for civil society development.

AREAS OF INITIAL COOPERATION:

- Research related to the positioning and development of civil society,
- Cooperation in the area of implementing international development aid,
- Non-profit media projects for the fostering of democratization and civil society development,
- Cooperation in the area of transfer of knowledge and experience from the Republic of Croatia on the international level, and cooperation in the area of participation of international experts in conferences and meetings in our country.

Upon the conclusion of initial cooperation, on the basis of evaluation of project implementation results and the expressed need for further development of areas encompassed by the cooperation, the National Foundation can decide to move on from the initial level to the level of programme cooperation by concluding multi-annual agreements on cooperation. A multi-annual agreement on programme cooperation implies a kind of organizational and professional support of the National Foundation to the cooperating organization for the implementation of the targeted form of cooperation.

Research

The National Foundation for Civil Society Development supports research projects related to the positioning and development of civil society in the Republic of Croatia, fostering at the same time the establishment of independent organizations directed towards and made capable for the conduct of social research.

The requirement for the offer of cooperation is compliance with the given research topics and agreed cooperation with scientific research institutions. The given topics in 2010 were:

- Research on the level of development of corporate social responsibility and donations for public benefit purposes of the profit sector in relation to tax rebates;
- Research on indicators of contributions of civil society organizations to the democratization of the Croatian society;
- Research on the introduction of educational content which facilitates the adoption of values, attitudes, knowledge and skills necessary for the understanding of active participation of citizens in democratic social processes

(democratic citizenship, civil society, human rights, intercultural education etc.), where creativity, innovations and quality are expected in the development of programmes (using both own and the best of the world experiences in education for democratic citizenship and human rights);

- Analysis of the legal and institutional framework for the activities of non-profit media with the aim of strengthening democratization and civil society development, and comparative analysis with EU member states;
- Research on the number, structure and challenges in employment in the non-profit sector in the Republic of Croatia;
- Research on the level, possibilities and challenges of the development of social entrepreneurship in the Republic of Croatia and in EU member states;
- Research on the previous practice and institutionalization of cooperation of local and regional self-government units and civil society organizations in the Republic of Croatia.

Grants for the implementation of research projects are given for a one year period.

At the tender for the expression of interest, the National Foundation received 9 applications, 6 of which fulfilled the stipulated criteria. In the evaluation process agreement was achieved on linking two similar and complimentary proposals, hence one research project was supported, implemented by two associations.

International Development Aid

In line with the Act on Development Aid and Humanitarian Assistance Abroad, development aid is an instrument of development cooperation and implies technical cooperation and programme assistance that more developed countries give to the developing ones in order to promote their sustainable economic, social, political (democratic) and environmental development, improve the quality of basic health services and promote economic cooperation.

With this call the National Foundation encourages all organizations with experience and interest in implementing projects of international cooperation and development aid, to apply and express their interest for cooperation in further activities with this aim. The call is open to projects of establishing regional and cross-border cooperation and provision of development aid aimed at democratization and civil society development solely through cooperation in training and transfer of knowledge, experience, skills and/or technology, or activities which transfer knowledge and experience created in civil society organizations and/or public authority bodies registered in Croatia to civil society organizations and/or public authority bodies on the national or local level in the countries of Southeast Europe (Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo, Serbia, Monte Negro, Macedonia and Albania), and in the countries in which the Republic of Croatia actively participates in international peacekeeping missions.

The thematic priorities for 2011 encompass three basic areas: healthcare, education and cross-sector cooperation i.e. cooperation of the government and civil society organizations.

The requirement for the offer of cooperation is compliance with the given forms of cooperation and thematic priorities and accepted cooperation in the receiving country.

Initial cooperation in the implementation of international development aid is carried out over a one year period.

12 applications were received at the call for expression of interest in initial cooperation in the area of implementation of international development aid, 11 applications which fulfilled the stipulated criteria were evaluated, and 4 projects were rated as being of best quality and resulted in the signing of agreements on initial cooperation.

Non-profit Media Projects

In line with the basic objectives of its activities, the National Foundation for Civil Society Development supports the creation and implementation of non-profit media projects for the fostering of democratization and civil society development in the Republic of Croatia.

With this call the National Foundation encourages all organizations and individuals active within non-profit organizations and having adequate experience and knowledge in the organization and implementation of non-profit media projects (portals, radio or TV shows, printed media) to apply and express their interest in cooperation on further development of democracy and civil society through the expansion of public and media space.

The requirement for the offer of cooperation is compliance with the Criteria for the Standardization of Quality of Non-profit Media Projects for the Fostering of Democratization and Civil Society Development in the Republic of Croatia. The criteria on quality standards for non-profit media projects are an integral part of the *Instructions for Submission of Offers*, and other requirements of the application to this call for expression of interest are established in line with them.

Initial cooperation in the implementation of media projects is carried out for a period of one year.

26 applications were received for the call for expression of interest in initial cooperation in the area of non-profit media projects for the fostering of democratization and civil society development, 20 applications which fulfilled the stipulated criteria were evaluated, and 5 projects rated as being of best quality resulted in the signing of agreements on initial cooperation.

Transfer of Knowledge and Experience

Knowledge without Borders

Cooperation in the area of transfer of knowledge and experience from Croatia on the international level, and cooperation in the area of participation of international experts on conferences in the Republic of Croatia

In its two categories, the call for expression of interest in cooperation titled "Knowledge without Borders" had the aim of providing support to the participation of representatives of Croatian associations in international conferences abroad, and enabling international experts to participate in conferences organized by associations in Croatia.

The purpose of this call is to foster the acquisition and exchange of knowledge, skills and experience necessary for active and enterprising action in the community and the society, as well as cooperation and networking of civil society organizations on the European and international level.

This call for expression of interest was continuously open throughout 2010, and grant beneficiaries implemented their activities in the same year.



68 received applications
48 sent for evaluation
26 approved grants

A total of 68 applications were received at the "Knowledge without Borders" call for expression of interest in both categories (A and B), 48 were evaluated, and 26 applications rated as being of best quality resulted in the signing of agreements on co-financing.

Participation in International Conferences and Arrival of International Experts to Conferences in Croatia

By the end of 2010, out of a total of 26 supported participations in international conferences, 7 associations active in the development of social entrepreneurship through the provision of social welfare, health protection and family services were co-financed, 5 associations each active in the promotion and protection of human rights, enhancement of democratic institutions in the society and the rule of law, and associations for the youth, as well as 3 associations active in non-institutional culture, media and implementation of IT technology in civil society development. Support was also provided to 2 associations active in the protection of nature, environment and sustainable development and 2 working on regional development, as well as to one active in the development of volunteering and one active in non-institutional education for the development of democratic citizenship.

Thus, representatives of associations were enabled to participate in international conferences, where they presented their results and insights and established international contacts. Moreover, within the same call, associations from Croatia were enabled to have at their conferences (where a participation fee was charged) international experts from abroad.

PROGRAMME COOPERATION

Programme cooperation represents a higher form of implementation of the National Foundation's operational activities, in which out of the total number of initially established cooperations those that are of best quality and deemed most necessary for further development of the civil society in certain areas are identified.

In this way, upon completion of initial cooperation and based on the results of evaluation of project implementation and the expressed need for further development of areas encompassed by the cooperation, the National Foundation can decide to move from the initial level to the level of programme cooperation by concluding multi-annual agreements of cooperation.

A multi-annual agreement of programme cooperation implies a certain type of organizational and professional support.

The National Foundation implements programme cooperation in the following areas:

- Non-profit media projects, and
- Support in the establishment and activities of specialized independent organizations for the conduct of social research in civil society development.

Programme cooperation cannot be concluded without previous initial cooperation. Programme cooperation can be concluded for a period of no less than two, and no more than five years.

Programme Cooperation in the Non-profit Media

On the basis of evaluation results for the implementation of non-profit media projects upon completion of initial cooperation, the National Foundation concluded agreements on programme cooperation in the non-profit media with four civil society organizations and thus rendered a long-term and more systematic support to their non-profit media possible: to one radio news service, one TV show on the local level, and two web portals.

The approved media are active in the following areas: web magazine aimed at democratization of the society and expansion of the public space and public speech, informing about the youth for the youth, radio news service with an overview of events in civil society organizations, and one TV show which deals with human rights issues and civil society development.

Programme cooperation with the National Foundation in the area of non-profit media will be made possible for the four associations by a multi-annual agreement on cooperation, which represents a kind of organizational and professional support of the National Foundation to the cooperating organization for the implementation of non-profit media for the fostering of democratization and civil society development in the Republic of Croatia.

IMPLEMENTATION OF INITIAL, PROGRAMME AND DEVELOPMENT COOPERATION IN 2010

Research Conducted in 2010

During 2010, based on the call for expression of interest for research related to the positioning and development of civil society in Croatia, launched in 2009, three research projects were implemented in cooperation with the National Foundation.

Political Literacy of the Youth

Through the research of political knowledge, values and behaviour of high school seniors from all Croatian counties, an analysis was conducted on political competency for the purpose of establishing the end impact of mandatory education. An overview was created of existing research in the area, as well as an analysis of the official curriculum of related courses and of the textbooks used in teaching. The level of political competency and the level of success in transferring the curriculum goals were measured, and a research report was drawn up with an overview of collected data, their analysis and interpretation.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT AND ACHIEVEMENT OF MINIMUM STANDARDS OF POLITICAL LITERACY AMONG YOUNG PEOPLE IN CROATIA:

- Political literacy must be increased through formal education with the inclusion of different types of informal education,
- Conditions and programmes must be provided for the acquisition of minimum levels of knowledge and accept adequate values.

Peace Education

A survey (questionnaire) was conducted in schools, as well as an analysis of the institutional framework, and data was also collected on projects of associations which implement their projects of social skills learning in schools in Zagreb. In parallel with project activities, an advocacy coalition was established with the aim of publicly promoting peace education, in cooperation with other civil society organizations.

CIVICUS Civil Society Index in Croatia

Within the project, 210 surveys were collected from civil society organizations and analyzed, as well as 63 surveys from other stakeholders (representatives of public institutions, local and regional self-government, donors, academic community, media, institutions and others); 6 regional consultations – focus groups were held with 60 participants in total; a national workshop was held (35 stakeholders) where research findings were presented and discussed and recommendations for the strengthening of the role of civil society were jointly established.

In the projects related to the positioning and development of civil society in Croatia, 6 employees and about 30 volunteers from civil society organizations participated, as well as 3 experts from scientific research institutions.

Implementation of Non-profit Media Projects

In 2010, the National Foundation continued its cooperation with non-profit media projects for the fostering of democratization and civil society development in the Republic of Croatia, approved in the previous year.

TV, Radio, Internet

During 2010, the National Foundation cooperated with 9 non-profit media projects. The supported projects achieved impressive results – the projects demonstrated great activity with regard to the content production: two projects of TV shows produced over 50 features, some of them watched in the wider Croatian territory, there were over 1500 broadcast radio shows (including reruns on local radio stations) prepared by four projects, and all three web portals contributed to informing. In this way media coverage was achieved on the entire Croatian territory.

Topics in the Media Content

The media content is directed towards a wider audience and encompasses a large range of topics from the civil society: social and political activities of women and men promoting gender equality and related topics, orientation on the youth, with content for the promotion and presentation of local associations, as well as the promotion of successful models of cooperation with the local or regional self-government, or with Croatian experts and intellectuals both within and outside the country, with the aim of supporting public dialogue for the interested public and with the potential of opening new space for the influence of information on civil society. Furthermore, news was transferred and current topics on civil society organizations were analyzed, the wider public was taught on terms often used in the Croatian public, political and media space, pertaining to the political culture and social engagement of citizens, citizens were informed on European integrations and gender equality was discussed. Four projects were referred to Programme Cooperation due to their quality and impact on the public.

Implementation of International Development Aid

In cooperation with the National Foundation, four projects of international cooperation and development aid of the Republic of Croatia were implemented in 2010.

Development Aid to Bosnia and Herzegovina and to Serbia

Knowledge and skills on different models of community mobilization were improved, as well as knowledge on writing projects in line with EU standards. Moreover, permanent consultancy was established, and examples of good practice in civil society development in Croatia presented increased the motivation and capacities for the creation of new and/or transfer of the same models into the communities in Bosnia and Herzegovina and in Serbia.

Transfer of Knowledge on Sustainable Management of the Environment

Croatian knowledge and experiences in the democratization of the defence system and in the introduction of an environmental management system, as well as examples of good practice in the protection of nature, environment and public health in military activities were transferred to civil society organizations, government institutions and health institutions in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Professional Competence

The development of professional competence of representatives of Serbian civil society organizations was fostered, as well as the integration of their practical activities with the adopted theories and knowledge on the suppression of violence against women, according to the models and good practice created in Croatia.



In the implementation of non-profit media projects for the fostering of democratization and civil society development 18 employees of civil society organizations and about 100 volunteers participated.

Rural Development: EU LEADER Approach

Discussions were held on the situation and orientations related to the rural development in Serbia. Experience was demonstrated, as well as the state of affairs and the process of recognizing and adopting the LEADER approach in Croatia. During the implementation of this project interest was constantly increasing for the inclusion of additional stakeholders, which resulted in the final number of 33 stakeholders included in the process.

The transfer of knowledge and methods created and/or developed in Croatia and their adaptation as original national experiences to the specificities of each of the receiving countries was achieved in cooperation with the National Foundation and partner organizations.

In the projects implemented in 2010 in the area of implementation of international development aid of the Republic of Croatia, titled "Development through Cooperation", 15 employees of civil society organizations and about 20 volunteers participated. The implementation of projects encompassed about 750 beneficiaries in total in the countries receiving international development aid.

Implementation of Development Cooperation

The programme of development cooperation is the result of the National Foundation's awareness of the need to establish on one hand fast and adaptable one-time grants which foster in a timely manner civil society development not only in Croatia, but on the international level, and on the other hand systematic investments into development, primarily of civil society organizations, but also of all other stakeholders involved in the development of the society as a whole, through an increase in the quality of action and cross-sector cooperation.

In line with the Ordinance on the Conditions and Method of Grant Allocation for the National Foundation's Purposes, during 2010 cooperation was established in the area of development cooperation by systematic investment into the civil society development with the Academy for Political Development from Zagreb, with the aim of implementing a training programme for civil society organizations in IMPACT – European Centre for Cross-sector Partnership, recognizing in this way the need to react to the demands of the civil society.

Within the implementation of the training programme, during 2010 the Academy for Political Development organized and cooperated in the implementation of several activities related to the design and implementation of programmes of training leaders in civil society organizations (Leadership Development Programme). In addition, representatives of civil society organizations received training in the programme of cross-sector links through the certified programme of the Academy and the Council of Europe. All of the above was implemented through a range of events organized during the previous year, such as Annual Seminars (in March and May of 2010), as well as the seminar titled Summer University for Democracy (July 2010 in the Council of Europe, Strasbourg).

Furthermore, during 2010 cooperation was established with the Human Rights House, Zagreb, on the project of establishing a referral and specialized independent centre for social research in the promotion and protection of human rights in the Republic of Croatia. During 2010, the Human Rights House cooperated intensively with numerous civil society organizations and institutions and a range of activities were jointly implemented. Continuous cooperation was also established with the Centre for Human Rights and the Office of the Ombudsman, with the Croatian Youth Network and with the Advocacy Network coordinated by GONG.

The Human Rights House thus began to achieve its long-term objective: the intention of becoming a centre for the enhancement of knowledge and practice of human rights, and for initiatives which foster the processes of democratization, the rule of law and creation of a more just society.

Implementation of Programme Cooperation in 2010

TV Shows

Two non-profit media in the area of TV shows produced over 50 different forms of TV features: reportages, short features, video clips.

Local and regional TV stations broadcast 10 informative and educational shows on civil society organizations and civil initiatives on local and regional levels, in cities and towns in 17 counties. With their focus on civil society, its values and topics related to it, the shows informed the local public on the work of the civil society and the advantages for the inhabitants of the areas where the civil society is more active.

Unlike the media active on the local level, despite the continued and rich production of TV content and due to the programme policy of the public TV, in 2010 the non-profit media on the national level did not have the possibility of continuously broadcasting video features so they were available to the public only on video channels and web portals.

Web Portal

The publisher of the internet non-profit media which implemented Programme Cooperation with the National Foundation in 2010, strengthened and promoted in the Croatian media space with numerous newspaper features (200 original articles, 700 news items) values advocated and promoted by the civil society.

In 2010, the National Foundation implemented Programme Cooperation in the area of non-profit media development with three organizations: two dealing with the TV show production and one organization managing a web portal

In the final reports submitted to the National Foundation, cooperating organizations in the fields of research, non-profit media projects and projects of international cooperation and development aid evaluated their cooperation with the National Foundation. The majority of cooperating organizations, notably 75%, rated the cooperation as very good. They expressed particular satisfaction with the technical and professional support that was provided in an adequate and timely manner, and it was emphasized that the workers of the National Foundation gave necessary information in a timely manner and with their comments and suggestions contributed to the better quality of project implementation.

Evaluation of Non-profit Media

In late 2010, a specialized agency for the monitoring and evaluation of media features performed the services of monitoring, analyzing media content and evaluating media announcements of non-profit media which were financially supported by the National Foundation. The monitoring and evaluation of media features was conducted over a one month period in the following media: radio stations, TV stations and web portals. According to research results, non-profit media were classified according to the estimated values of published features.

Thus it was shown that features from web portals have the highest estimated value, followed by TV features, with radio shows having the smallest value. In the period of monitoring there were 203 features published on web portals, and their value was estimated at HRK 2,728,302, on local and regional TV stations 14 features were broadcast in the value of HRK 1,138,672, and 4 radio features would have had the value of HRK 632.

DECENTRALIZED MODEL OF FINANCING CIVIL SOCIETY DEVELOPMENT

In 2007, the National Foundation began implementing the Decentralized Model of Financing Civil Society Development in the Republic of Croatia in partnership with four regional foundations. The partnership was continued in 2010 with the continued decentralized allocation of financial resources for the tender for civil initiatives "Our Contribution to the Community".

The tender serves to finance civil initiatives which foster the development of the local community, concretely resolve a problem in the local community and thus improve the conditions and quality of life in that community, encouraging volunteer work and inclusion of citizens, as well as using potentials of the local public and profit sector.

Regional foundations launched 2 tenders for civil initiatives "Our Contribution to the Community", one on 4 May, and the other on 1 October 2010.



A civil initiative is a one-time action encouraging activism, improving the quality of life or general wellbeing in the local community. It is instigated by a group of individuals in the local community who respond to the perceived problem with volunteer work, knowledge, or material goods.

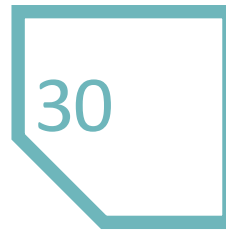

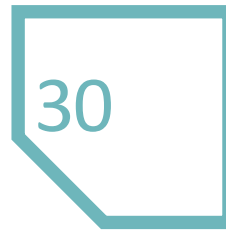

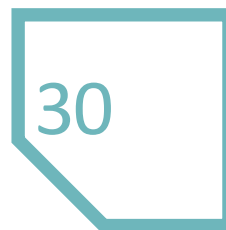

“Kajo Dadić” Foundation from Split

In 2010, the “Kajo Dadić” Foundation from Split provided financial support to 30 civil initiatives, which is 14 more than in 2009. The largest number of approved initiatives, 20, pertains to the territory of the Split-Dalmatia and Šibenik-Knin counties.

Environmental Awareness

The initiative implemented in Zadar contributed to the development of environmental awareness in children by informing them on PET packaging and how it should be separated, while in Knin this was done by planting 75 new trees and distributing brochures on the significance of trees. Members of the mountaineering society from Drniš marked landfills in the Promina mountain, which encouraged competent services to refurbish them.

The refurbishment of 3 ecological stations in northern Marjan gathered 800 participants. In Tisno an old tank was renovated, and in Biograd n/m the sea bed was cleaned along the promenade on the main town quay. The locals on the island of Šolta decided to plant a garden with only autochthonous plants in order to protect and promote them.

Leisure Time

By refurbishing the existing sports and children’s playgrounds the citizens of Kruševo, Postire, Ist and Podšpilje made it possible for children and young people to spend their free time in a better and safer way, and in the Šibenik neighborhood of Vidice 2 children’s playgrounds were refurbished in line with the European regulations on playground safety. Furthermore, through joint actions of the students, parents and teachers the surroundings of primary schools in Bibinje and in Sv. Filip i Jakov were refurbished.

Around us

The initiative of an association from Knin acquainted young people with the establishment and activities of the Youth Council in Knin, and motivated them for active participation through promotional flyers and posters.

With the aim of improving the quality of life for persons with special needs, one of the initiatives was focused on building an access path to St. Bartholomew’s Centre in Knin, and 3 campaigns were implemented in which the citizens of Šibenik and Split were acquainted with the problems and needs of persons with special needs, of deaf and blind persons and of autistic persons.

OLD AND NEW HERITAGE

The initiative of an association from Šibenik familiarized citizens with the cave of St. Anthony as one of the cultural landmarks in the surroundings. Primary school pupils in Metković researched the history of Narona, and presented it to the local community with a picture book. In Srinjine, a public campaign was launched related to the culture of reading and the school library fund was replenished. With the refurbishment of the existing stage in the Knin Castle, citizens were given a place where they can have cultural programmes, and in the park in Stomorska an old fountain was renovated for the purpose of preserving the town’s cultural and historical heritage.

In 2010, the Foundation for Partnership and Civil Society Development from Pula financed 30 civil initiatives of which the majority, 25, were related to the refurbishment of the environment and public surfaces, i.e. improvement of quality of life in the community, while 4 initiatives were implemented for children and the youth, and 1 pertained to democratization and human rights.

Refurbishment of the Environment

Through the initiative implemented in Kastav, the locals had the opportunity to replace plastic bags with eco bags.

Activities implemented within financed initiatives resulted in refurbished pedestrian and bicycle paths in Bokordiči (Svetvinčenat) and in the Rijeka port Delfin. Activities of environment refurbishment were implemented in Otočac, where a rest area was refurbished alongside an archaeological site and the Pečina source along Gacka, in Pernat where a network of paths was refurbished and a guide was made for the Gerbin area, in Rijeka, where a pond was refurbished in the Draški stream basin for easier access and as a pedagogical facility for children with special needs. In Vrhovine, activities were organized to refurbish the Krajinovac waterway, and in Karlobag to refurbish an old water tank with information in several languages. With owl houses and interpretation boards the citizens and guests of Malinska were acquainted with the importance of owls in the preservation of biodiversity, and in Buje a garden pond representing the freshwater world was renovated as part of the refurbished promenade and arboretum. Moreover, two initiatives resulted in refurbished beaches in Cerovlje and in Skrad on the Dobra river.

Refurbishment of Green Surfaces

For the needs of social activities of the wider community, the surroundings of community clubs in Donji Lapac, Klanac and Kastav were refurbished, as well the centre of the village of Jopi in the Sveti Petar u šumi municipality, while the joint action of locals resulted in the refurbishment of an office facility for the Local Committee of Gornje Vrhovine.

Through the initiatives children's playgrounds were refurbished in Vrhovine, Pazin, Labin and Crikvenica, as well as a children's playground in the area of Roverija.

For a Child's Smile

The initiative in Lovran resulted in the refurbishment of a paediatric surgery which will in the future resound with merry children's laughter, while the children of Grožnjan received their first playroom in which they will be able to spend time together, play, create and learn. The initiative for children from Cres combined environmental elements and creativity of children who learned to make characters from a well known picture book of wool, and to speak out through their own creative expression about human faults in a humorous way.

**POST OFFICE
TURNS INTO POSTA**
Members and volunteers of Kumpanija Kosirići refurbished the space of the old post office in Tinjan, which they and their fellow citizens can now use to get acquainted with instruments, for rehearsals and exhibitions, and to provide information on the folk heritage and tradition of the area.





The Loud Week initiative in Mali Lošinj acquainted citizens with the rights of children and young people with special needs, with the need for their integration and the problems they face, but also with the potentials they possess. In Pula, the International Volunteer Day was marked by a volunteer action directed towards unconscientious drivers who interfere with the free movement of citizens, and by the presentation of good practice of volunteering.

Foundation for Local Community Development “Slagalica”, Osijek

The Foundation for Local Community Development provided grants for 30 initiatives in the territory of 5 counties, which gathered a large number of volunteers, prompted local entrepreneurs and craftsmen, as well as local self-government units, to provide support in the implementation of initiatives which contributed to the improvement of living conditions in the community.

For Children and the Youth

The largest number of initiatives pertained to the refurbishment of space intended for children and young people. Hence sports playgrounds were refurbished in Pakrac and Orahovica, the playground of the kindergarten in Bršadin, and playgrounds in Slatina and Gornja Šumetlica. For better quality leisure time, initiatives were implemented to refurbish school playgrounds in Požega, Grabovac, Bakić and Viljevo. Children and young people in Miholjački Poreč were given a space in which different creative, informative and education programmes will take place, while in Belišće the floor was renovated in the only space for young people in which they spend their free time on a daily basis.

Tourist Potential

Actions of environment refurbishment resulted in 3 refurbished landfills in Kopački rit and refurbished and equipped source of natural water Studenac in Pleternica, which enhanced the tourist potential of the community. Citizens of Borovo were informed of problems caused by ambrosia and participated in the action of destroying this problematic weed. In Čačinci, fish ponds were refurbished for parents and children to be able to enjoy their time outdoors, in Voćino a neglected park was renovated, while in Lipik, Lekin brijeg which was damaged in the Homeland War, was refurbished.

Caring for the Space

An interesting initiative took place in Čagli (Latinovac), where public space on the bus station was refurbished and will serve as a rest area and shelter from rain, but also as an advertising space and place for exchanging village products. In Slavonski Brod, the access road to a Roma settlement was refurbished. A praiseworthy initiative happened in the town of Toranj (Pakrac), where the surroundings of the only trefoil Gothic church in this part of Europe were refurbished.

For a Better Community

Among initiatives for which financial support was approved, there were also actions of refurbishing the space of the Pakrac library, and of building a greenhouse for flowers from which in May seedlings are given out to citizens of Vukovar for the decoration of their gardens and balconies. In Vukovar and Borovo naselje, 8 bicycle stands were put up with the aim of promoting the use of this healthy, cheap vehicle.

By the initiative of an association from Požega, multiple sclerosis patients raised funds for children who need an assistant in studying. An initiative in Osijek strived to encourage the development of social sensitivity in children, primary school pupils, through their contact with mentally retarded persons. In Osijek, a campaign was implemented against unconscientious drivers who park their cars in places for disabled persons.

FILM, THEATRE, STAGE
Citizens of Donji Miholjac were given projections of non-profit films during the summer months, which added to the offer of cultural events in the town, while in Vukovar a movable theatre stage was built for children's theatre plays, and in the town of Oprisavci a facility was refurbished for the permanent exhibition of a collection of old items with the aim of preserving the cultural and natural heritage.

Regional Foundation for Local Development "Zamah", Zagreb

In the territory of central Croatia, the Regional Foundation for Local Development "Zamah" from Zagreb provided financial support for 40 civic initiatives which through targeted influence on different social groups contributed to the resolution of different problems for the general benefit of the community.

For Public Interest

Owing to the initiative of an association from Sisak, the inhabitants of the Klinac village were able to enjoy again the amenities of the use of drinking water after the renovation of the water supply system which had been neglected for 15 years, and in Majur, at the initiative of the library and reading club, a visiting theatre play was organized for the locals because of the insufficient offer of such events.

Civil society development was also aided by the initiative of an association from Zagreb, where a campaign was conducted for the protection of public space and public interest in Varšavska street. Likewise, an initiative in Karlovac contributed to improved cooperation of associations with local self-government units, within which associations expressed their needs and views, which resulted in the provision of the *Muza Centre* which is currently used by 9 associations. Associations from the area of Sabroski were given a refurbished space to work in.





Environment and Sustainable Development

Implemented initiatives helped clean the centre of Graboštani, green surfaces in Mihovljan, and the border parts of Čakovac from small and large waste and ambrosia, the centre of Rude through 6 small community actions, while in Jastrebarsko the landfill near a water well was cleaned.

Care for the environment and sustainable development was also expressed in initiatives of reforestation by autochthonous types of trees in Čakovec, setting up a container and informing the inhabitants of Velika Pisanica on the importance of sorting waste, building of compost corners and solar showers in Gvozd, organized collection of plastic bags and their replacement with cloth bags in Zagreb, and organizing eco-workshops for the children from the wider area of the Dvor municipality, while at the initiative of a primary school in Karlovac, volunteer teams were organized which will go around city neighbourhoods on bicycles and inform citizens on the ways to help abandoned dogs. In Vukomerić, a multimedia library was refurbished with the aim of preserving and disseminating sustainable knowledge and skills.

As in the previous year many areas were threatened by floods, initiatives in Karlovac and Češko Selo in Petrinja resolved utility problems caused by the floods.

Caring for the Space

At the initiative of 2 associations the quality of life was improved for the inhabitants of the Roma settlements Capraška poljana and Palanjak, for whom the relocation of a landfill near the settlement was organized, as well as the refurbishment of a building for the kindergarten and day care for about 70 children from this area.

Children's and sports playground were refurbished in Karlovac, Donja Stubica, Palešnik, Pregrada and Ozalj owing to the implemented initiatives, and young people in Žakanj had a space refurbished for better quality leisure time. Persons with special needs, beneficiaries of therapeutic horse-back riding services in Sisak and Zagreb were provided with the possibility to work constantly, regardless of the weather conditions, by the refurbishment of the riding-ground.

The initiative of a Vrbovec association provided assistance to socially threatened families and individuals through the collection and distribution of used items, and the community was familiarized with the problems and needs of socially sensitive fellow citizens, but also made aware of the responsible waste management and re-use concept.

MARTA THE SQUIRREL AND BOCKO THE ACORN

Through the initiative of a school from Karlovac, a picture book was created titled "Vjeverica Marta i žir Bocko" (Marta the Squirrel and Bocko the Acorn), which gives an incentive to the creative expressions of blind and visually impaired children, but also enables blind and visually impaired parents to read stories together with their children, which contributes to the strengthening of their parental role and mutual trust. The picture book will be used by the members of all 27 associations of blind and visually impaired persons in Croatia.

PROGRAMME OF REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND STRENGTHENING OF CAPACITIES OF CIVIL SOCIETY ORGANIZATIONS

In partnership with 5 regional networks of specialized civil society organizations active in the territory of southern, central, north-western and eastern Croatia, the National Foundation contributed to the harmonization of regional development and capacities of civil society organizations and civil initiatives by providing always available services of informing, consultations and education for civil society organizations as end beneficiaries.

In this respect, during 2010 the National Foundation continued to implement the Programme of Regional Development and Strengthening of Capacities of Civil Society Organizations on the Local and Regional Level, through five partner subprogrammes of regional networks – E-MISIJA, JAKO, MRRAK, STEP and ŠALTER.

The National Foundation's programme of regional development represents the fulfilment of one of its key strategic goals and at the same time of one of the goals of the National Strategy for the Creation of an Enabling Environment for Civil society and measures related to the harmonization of regional development of civil society organizations in the Republic of Croatia.

Organizations involved in the Programme implementation are expected to support civil society organizations through training programmes, consultations and informing, and familiarity with the local situation and needs for the development of civil society organizations through communication and cooperation with other stakeholders on the local and regional level.

During 2010, in addition to the services of informing, consultations and training for civil society organizations, the regional networks also provided services of providing space in the total duration of 661 hours and services of providing equipment in the duration of 60 hours. Furthermore, over 2000 photocopies were made for the needs of civil society organizations.

TRAINING AND INFORMING

Within the Programme, a total of 3019.5 hours of informing and 901 hours of consultations were spent with representatives of civil society organizations. Moreover, 152 workshops were organized in which 2112 beneficiaries participated. A total of 802.5 hours were spent on training through workshops, of which 102.5 hours pertained to public activities of civil society organizations, and 44 to cooperation and networking.



CO-FINANCING OF SALARIES
Financing of five regional networks in 2010 provided co-financing of salaries for 34 persons who participated in the Programme implementation.

E-MISIJA

The *E-misija* programme is implemented in the Karlovac, Krapina-Zagorje, Sisak-Moslavina, and Zagreb counties and in the City of Zagreb. It is implemented by the associations Centre for Civil Initiatives Zagreb and IKS Petrinja.

SOS Info Points

During the year, 627.5 hours of informing in total were provided. Information was continuously published on the web page. The database was updated and now has 794 organizations. In line with the plan, SOS info points were active in Zagreb, Karlovac, Petrinja and Zabok, and mobile points were held in Glina, Dvor, Sisak, Ozalj, Zaprešić and Dugo Selo. A Facebook group was also activated which regularly communicates with its members. The network published news on the internet in the form of electronic newsletters on a monthly basis. The information provided pertained to information on the programme, establishment of associations, possibility of financing for CSOs, financial management of CSOs, preparation of project proposals, elaboration of action plans, applications for PADOR etc.

Mobile Teams

A total of 250.5 hours were spent on consultations with CSOs. A virtual SOS point was set up and managed on the website. Associations also had at their disposal SOS points and mobile teams. Assistance was provided for associations in several aspects of activities: legal aspects of establishment and registration, drafting of the statute, financial management of the association, public relations etc.

Workshops

The total number of hours related to training is 209, of which 155 pertains to organizational development, 46 to public action, and 8 to cooperation and networking. During the year one presentation was held and one round table, as well as 21 half-day and 13 all-day workshops.

JAKO

The *Jako* programme is implemented in the Bjelovar-Bilogora, Koprivnica-Križevci, Međimurje and Varaždin counties. It is implemented by ACT – Autonomous Centre Čakovec and association K.V.A.R.K. Križevci.

Informing

Over the year 453.5 hours of informing were held in total, through info points in the organizations, 16 mobile info points, 48 issues of e-newsletters and 5 issues of printed newsletters. Furthermore, 405 news items were published on the website.

64 hours of consultations were given through info points, mobile info points, meetings, e-mail, telephone and Skype. Consultations pertained to the issues related to the establishment of associations, financial dealings of associations, social entrepreneurship and organizational development.

Training Areas

A total of 202.5 hours were spent on training, of which 150.5 were related to organizational development, 28 hours were related to public action, and 24 were related to cooperation and networking. Four lectures were given, as well as 34 half-day workshops on the topics of internet as a media for promotion and communication, basics of computer use, EU funds, public relations, fundraising, animation, motivation and work of the volunteers, analysis of community problems and needs, project proposals, budgeting, programme monitoring and evaluation, financial management and Europe for citizens. Training programmes were used by 389 beneficiaries in total. The network gave the beneficiaries the possibility of using a multimedia hall free of charge in the total duration of 261 hours.

Impact on the Public

During the year, the Network had a dozen announcements published in the printed media, about 20 announcements on web portals, a dozen appearances on radio and TV stations, and continuously published information through online tools. Considering the above, one can speak of satisfactory presence in the public.

MRRAK

The *Mrrak* programme is implemented in the Istra, Primorje-Gorski Kotar and Lika-Senj counties. It is implemented by the Association for Civil Society Development SMART Rijeka, Delta Association Rijeka, and *Pokretač* Association Korenica.

Informing

Over the entire year, beneficiaries received different information through the internet, e-mail, monthly newsletter MRRAK and tri-monthly newsletter Info-Smart. The distributed information pertained to launched tenders, training possibilities, information on gatherings and events etc. During the year, a total of 82 information items were published on the website and 99 information items were delivered by e-mail. E-mail lists were distributed in counties, and contain 549 beneficiaries in total.

Information Points

Network members were continuously accessible to beneficiaries through info points in the seats of organizations, notably in the Smart association every working day, in the Delta association every Monday, and in the *Pokretač* association on Tuesdays and Thursdays. In info points during 2010, a total of 287 different queries were posed.

Statistics

With regard to the consultations during the year, there were 141 queries. Consultations were most often used for the following areas: establishment and registration of an association, association activities, financial records keeping, change of statute and restructuring, fundraising etc. Within the programme, 14 all-day and 4 half-day workshops were held. All of the topics covered pertain to organizational development. The total duration of training is 111 hours, while 237 participants participated in workshops, meaning 13 participants per workshop. Workshop participants had the opportunity to express interest in further use of services through an evaluation form.

Mobile Teams

With the aim of presenting the programme, 14 mobile teams were organized in all the major towns in all three counties. Each mobile team included a meeting with the representatives of the municipality or the town, a meeting with associations and an invitation to the local media. Thus 105 people participated in the presentations.

RADIO SPOT

In 2010 a radio spot was created which was broadcast over 60 times during November and December on 4 radio stations in 3 counties.

STEP

The *Step* programme is implemented in the Dubrovnik-Neretva, Split-Dalmatia, Šibenik-Knin and Zadar counties. It is implemented by the associations "MI" Split and UTIRUŠ Trogir.

Statistics

Over the year, the Step Programme participated in informing its target public, the necessary information was collected, published and sent through the website, e-mail and by phone.

During 2010, 37 information items on different tenders were published on the website, and the page has an average of 200 unique visits on a workday. The list of e-mail recipients contains about 270 addresses, and 246 different information items were forwarded. In total, 956 hours were spent on informing.

Consultations

For the consultation services, 227 hours were spent. The services were provided in personal contact and by phone, and they were related to the programme, financial, legal and organizational functioning of the association.

The total duration of training was 171 hours. The workshops were solely half-day workshops, held in the afternoon. The topics of the training programme were: media relations, organizational development, financing possibilities for the associations, associations in the tax system, basics of non-profit accounting and financial reports. The workshops were attended by a total of 335 beneficiaries. Within the Step Programme 3 presentations were also given with 42 beneficiaries.

A plan was made to ensure visibility and public nature of the work.

ŠALTER

The Šalter Programme is implemented in the Brod-Posavina, Osijek-Baranja, Požega-Slavonija, Virovitica-Podravina and Vukovar-Srijem counties. It is implemented by the associations PRONI Centre for Social Education Vukovar, Volunteer Centre Osijek and P.G.D.I. – Civil Democratic Initiative Project Beli Manastir.

Public Relations

Over the year media coverage of the programme was increased, mostly through the electronic media. Namely, in 2010 the website recorded 29253 individual visits.

During the year, 369 hours were spent on informing. Information was available by telephone, mail and personal contact. Information pertained to launched tenders and tenders dossiers, establishment, registration and functioning of associations, training possibilities, social entrepreneurship and information on the Programme.

Information was also available through flyers, newsletter, magazines and hand-books available in the offices of the organizations.

Consultations

Consultations were conducted over 229.5 hours. The advice pertained to the establishment and activities of associations, establishment of foundations, writing of project proposals, financial and narrative reporting on the implementation of activities, financial advice, legal advice, modes of cross-sector and sector cooperation.

109 hours were spent on training, of which 98.5 hours related to organizational development, 8.5 hours to public action, and 2 hours to cooperation and networking. During 2010, 31 workshops were held for about 510 direct participants. The training topics were: writing project proposals, team work methodology, social entrepreneurship, community organizing and civil initiatives, media and public relations, civil society and democracy, communication in the organization. 64 hours of consultations were given through info points, mobile info points, meetings, e-mails, by phone and Skype. Consultations pertained to issues related to the establishment of associations, financial dealings of associations, social entrepreneurship and organizational development.

Informing

Over the year, 453.5 hours of informing were given through info points in organizations, 16 mobile info points, 48 issues of e-newsletter and 5 issues of the printed newsletter. Moreover, 405 news items were published on the website. Information mostly pertained to fundraising, project cycle management, establishment of associations and organizational development.

The network gave the beneficiaries the possibility of using a multimedia hall free of charge, in the total duration of 261 hours.

Time spent on training was 202.5 hours, of which 150.5 hours were related to organizational development, 28 were related to public action, and 24 hours were related to cooperation and networking. Five lectures were given and 34 half-day workshops.

“EUROPE FOR CITIZENS”

“Europe for citizens” is a programme that provides financial support to projects which promote “active European citizenship”, and has been opened for Croatia since October 2007. The programme aims at strengthening citizens’ participation by enabling them to debate and exchange opinions on the EU, strengthening the European identity, developing the sense of belonging to the EU, and promoting intercultural dialogue between citizens.

In line with the Ordinance on the Conditions and Method of Grant Allocation for the National Foundation’s Purposes, and within the one-time support provided for development initiatives on the international level, the National Foundation adopted the Programme for Co-financing Approved Projects from the “Europe for Citizens” and “Cooperation in the Euro-Mediterranean” Programmes.

“COOPERATION IN THE EURO-MEDITERRANEAN”

The “Cooperation in the Euro-Mediterranean” programme includes grants to short-term and long-term projects and programmes selected through international tenders by the Anna Lindh Euro-Mediterranean Foundation for the Dialogue between Cultures (ALF). Tenders published by ALF aim to provide support to the implementation of activities conducted by the civil society of the Euro-Mediterranean region, with the purpose of promoting diversity and tolerance through intercultural dialogue.

The National Foundation was thus able to provide financial support to short-term and long-term projects supported through the aforementioned tenders published by the European Commission or the Anna Lindh Foundation in the amount of 20% of the total value of approved development initiative/project.

Through this form of cooperation, the National Foundation aims to support quality development initiatives/projects which were already found eligible for the allocation of grants from the EU and international sources, but are still missing the mandatory 20% of co-financing of the total project value. In 2010, the National Foundation provided financial support in the total amount of HRK 290,542.38 for 7 CSO projects approved within the aforementioned programmes.

INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

Croatian Network for Cooperation in the Euro-Mediterranean

Croatian Network for Cooperation in the Euro-Mediterranean was founded in January of 2009, with the National Foundation as Network coordinator. The activities of the Croatian Network for Cooperation in the Euro-Mediterranean are carried out in cooperation with the Anna Lindh Euro-Mediterranean Foundation for the Dialogue between Cultures (ALF) headquartered in Alexandria, Egypt, that presents a multilateral partnership framework within the Union for the Mediterranean which is an institutional follow-up of the Euro-Mediterranean partnership, known as the Barcelona Process.

Tasks of the Coordinator

As the coordinator of the Croatian Network, in 2010 the National Foundation managed the network, provided information on the activities and tenders published by ALF to its members and the general public, facilitated the search for project partners, assisted with project applications, ensured promotion of activities, organized coordination meetings for the Croatian Network members, maintained day-to-day communication with ALF Secretariat, and contributed to the development of annual and triennial ALF programmes.

86 Network Members

The interest and a great number of new members in its second year of work made the Croatian network one of the fastest growing new national networks of the Anna Lindh Foundation, with 86 members at the end of 2010. The Croatian Network is open to all institutions, organizations, and other partners that uphold the principles and mission of the Croatian Network, and functions in line with the principles of democratic, pluralistic, and multilateral values, primarily representing civil society stakeholders.

Activities in 2010

In the past year, representatives of the National Foundation and of 6 other member-organizations of the Croatian Network participated in activities of the *ALF Forum 2010* held in March 2010, in Barcelona, and presented the project *Faces of the Mediterranean*. The three-day forum was a combination of discussions on some key issues pertaining to intercultural relations between the people of the region, and acted as the first platform for numerous networks of national CSOs for the exchanges of ideas, development of new partnerships, and preparation of new activities on the local and international level.

Faces of the Mediterranean

Faces of the Mediterranean is an international exhibition of photographs capturing faces, scenes from everyday life, landscapes, monuments, and traditions of common Mediterranean heritage with the purpose of encouraging people of the region to examine their own perceptions of the Mediterranean and inherited stereotypes, to record this process and the subsequent change in perception. The project was the result of cooperation between several ALF national networks (Bulgaria, Cyprus, Montenegro, and Lebanon) that aimed at increasing intercultural exchange and cooperation, and reducing stereotypes and prejudices, thus increasing mutual tolerance. The exhibition was opened on 24 April 2010 in Zagreb and in other select partner cities. As a part of the exhibition, visitors had the opportunity to learn languages such as Hebrew, Arabic, Greek, Turkish, and Bulgarian, and to see the promotional video dedicated to the exhibition.

FACES OF THE MEDITERRANEAN – EXHIBITION CATALOGUE

In 2010, the coordinators of six national networks of CSOs gathered within the Anna Lindh Foundation network, organized the *Faces of the Mediterranean* exhibition, and by the end of 2010 published the catalogue of the exhibition. Within this cooperation, the national networks of Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Greece, Lebanon, and Montenegro collected, selected and published all photographs prepared for the exhibition followed by short biographies of 16 authors from all the countries involved in the implementation of the exhibition and finally published the catalogue in English.

The catalogue contains all photographs from the exhibition whose authors are both professionals and amateurs, depicting various cultural surroundings in which the photographs were taken, as well as various artistic sensibilities. At the same time, the catalogue brings a summary of visitors' comments that additionally enhance the multicultural expression of the exhibition emphasizing the aim of the project – increasing intercultural exchange and cooperation and working towards decreasing stereotypes and prejudices while developing tolerance.

43 ALF Delegations in Dubrovnik

After Zagreb, the *Faces of the Mediterranean* exhibition also opened in Pula, Rijeka, Petrinja, Omiš, Velika Gorica, Delnice, and finally in Dubrovnik, thus making an even greater impact on the general public in Croatia. In Dubrovnik, the exhibition was opened within the 30th Assembly of the Board of Governors of the Anna Lindh Foundation (ALF) and was attended by representatives of all 43 delegations of member states, as well as by ALF President, André Azoulay, ALF Executive Director, Andreu Claret, and representatives of ALF Secretariat from Alexandria.

EUROMED INTERCULTURAL TRENDS 2010

In 2010, the Anna Lindh Foundation published a report on the research titled “EuroMed Intercultural Trends 2010”.

The report presents the results of the research conducted on intercultural relations in 13 countries across Europe and southern and eastern Mediterranean region, indicating that under deeply rooted stereotypes there exist many common viewpoints, and a wish for peaceful co-existence. This is how the report was presented at the public presentation organized within the “Modes of Dialogue” Conference held in Brussels on 15 September 2010, which was jointly organized by the Anna Lindh Foundation and the King Baudouin Foundation.

The Anna Lindh Foundation report was divided into four main parts: “Public Poll Research” (including quantitative analysis by Gallup), “Expert Analysis and Good Practices” (including experts' articles), “Media Thematic Focus” (including country cases by media experts), and “Conclusions” (including proposals for action).



NGO Sustainability Index

Research titled *NGO Sustainability Index for Central and Eastern Europe and Eurasia* is a part of multi-annual operational activities of the USAID Bureau for Europe and Eurasia, carried out with the aim of assessing the level of civil society development in the countries of the stated regions – from the Baltic to central Asia.

The collected and processed data for each country represent a significant source of information, not only for USAID, but for other interested stakeholders, such as: international organizations and donors, CSO networks, researchers or other interested individuals.

Seven Dimensions of Sustainability

Through the analysis of seven dimensions important for civil society sustainability, the research highlighted the advantages, as well as disadvantages in the civil society development. At the same time, the given indexation facilitates comparison of results from other countries, and comparison within one country over a longer period of time. Although it possesses certain methodological limitations, the Index represents a significant tool in understanding and monitoring sustainability of the civil society.

Cooperation with USAID

In line with its past practice concerning the conduct of the NGO Sustainability Index research, the USAID (U.S. Agency for International Development) transferred the operational part of the research onto its local partners, which is why the National Foundation for Civil Society Development took over the implementation of an annual assessment of civil society development (Index). The Index is implemented in cooperation with USAID and their implementing organizations, with the inclusion of CSO representatives and other relevant stakeholders. The report on civil society development in Croatia for 2009 was finished in 2010 and added to the USAID annual publication that is also available on the following website: http://www.usaid.gov/locations/europe_eurasia/dem_gov/ngoindex/index.htm.

INDEX GROWTH

According to research results, the total assessment of civil society development has slightly increased in relation to the previous year, continuing the trend of gradual, but stabile Index growth, i.e. gradual progress towards more developed European societies. In this way, the assessment of civil society in Croatia is approaching the status of a stabile, structured and sustainable system.

RESEARCH CATEGORIES

Development assessments in the research are given for the following categories/dimensions: legal environment, organisational capacities, financial sustainability, advocacy, provision of services, infrastructure, and public image.

Beskućnici i ovisnici

Projekt demokratizacija državnih institucija i zagovaranje ljudskih prava beskućnika i ovisnika u lokalnoj zajednici

Osnovna svrha projekta je smanjenje diskriminacije, smanjenje kršenja ljudskih prava, povećanje poštovanja te poboljšanje socijalnog statusa beskućnika i ovisnika (o drogama i alkoholu).

Djelovanje je usmjereno kroz podršku državnim institucijama edukativnim treninzima i suradnjom te zagovaranjem prava beskućnika i ovisnika u područjima zapošljavanja, stambenog zbrinjavanja, socijalne, zdravstvene i pravne zaštite.

Okrugli stol

Na okruglom stolu "Ljudska prava ovisnika i beskućnika" održanom 17. studenog u Rijeci predstavljani su neki slučajevi diskriminacije ovisnika. Tako se intravenozni korisnici droga često susreću s diskriminacijom od strane zdravstvenog osoblja pa

nije rijetkost da su liječnici i stomatolozi odbili liječiti takvog pacijenta, a mnogi poslodavci daju otkaze radnicima za koje su saznali da su bivši ovisnici. Beskućnici, s druge strane, mnoga svoja prava ne mogu ostvariti, jer zbog činjenice da nemaju stalno prebivalište ne mogu imati osobne dokumente.

Tribina

Smanjenje stigmatizacije i negativnog stava prema ovisnicima, beskućnicima, osobama zaraženim HIV-om ili hepatitisom neobično je važno. Na tribini "Društvo bez stigme" (Rijeka, 1. prosinca) je istaknuto da je stigma nešto što se najteže i najsporije iskorištenje. U sklopu tribine održana je i predstava forum kazališta u kojoj je prikazan problem s kojim se mnogi ovisnici susreću - predrasuda „Jednom ovisnik - uvijek ovisnik“.



Na tribini je istaknuto da strah od stigme i diskriminacije obeshrabruje stigmatizirane osobe

INICIJATIVA
Valja inicirati izmjene zakona koje će jasnije definirati zdravstveno osiguranje, ali i ostvarivanje prava koje su beskućnici izgubili - prava na prebivalište i osobne dokumente.

komunikacijskih kanala događa simultano sa sveprisutnom krizom etabliranih, mainstream tiskanih i elektroničkih medija. Pod udarom krize, ali i zbog razvoja internetske tehnologije, mainstream mediji sve više gube svoju primarnu društvenu ulogu - svestrano informiranje, educiranje i uključivanje građana u javni dijalog kako bi mogli informirano sudjelovati u odlučivanju o važnim društvenim i političkim pitanjima. Takvo stanje poozbiljuje odgovornost neprofitnih medija - da budu odgovorni zajednici kojoj su posvećeni.

Mediji u zajednici trebaju biti neprofitni i nezavisni od političkih i komercijalnih središta moći.

Consultations, Workshops, Informing and Publishing

In 2010, the National Foundation continued working on the Information and Publishing Programme with the aim of collecting and disseminating professional knowledge and information important for the strengthening of capacities and development of CSOs. Within that programme, the following activities were implemented: organization of public consultations, collection and dissemination of official and professional knowledge and information through the website and electronic bulletin, creation of a professional and digitalized library, and updating of the website and portal content.

Public Consultations on the Improvement of Support System to Civil Society Development

During February and March 2010, the National Foundation conducted regional consultations with CSOs in Split, Zagreb, Rijeka, and Osijek regarding the improvement of the system and form of support for civil society development that it provides through its Grants Programme and operational activities. In the same period, the consultations were also available by electronic means.

The National Foundation reviewed the proposals given by the CSOs and after discussing them, accepted and included most of them in the new criteria and conditions for tenders and calls for expression of interest published in 2010.

PROPOSALS ACCEPTED FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF TENDERS AND CALLS FOR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST:

- Equal opportunities for obtaining financial support for more developed CSOs and for those operating mostly on a volunteer basis and on the local level
- More equal regional allocation of financial resources;
- Co-financing, pre-financing, and interim financing of projects financed from EU funds and programmes;
- Online networking of CSOs, forming databases and knowledge bases;
- Support to the development of local communities, volunteering, and cross-sector cooperation;
- Accessibility of all services offered by the Programme of Regional Development implemented by the National Foundation in smaller rural communities;
- Adaptability of the mandatory percentage of self-financing for CSOs beneficiaries of the National Foundation's institutional grants with the possibility of additional training on self-financing programmes;
- Improved standards for implementing Programme Cooperation in the area of non-profit media.

Co-organization of CSO Days

From 13 to 15 May 2010, IMPACT Centre in Zadar hosted CSO Days 2010 organized by the Government's Office for Cooperation with NGOs, Council for Civil Society Development, National Foundation for Civil Society Development, and TASC0 (Technical Assistance to Civil Society Organizations) project team in Croatia.

The central topic of the CSO Days was the role and contribution of CSOs in using EU funds. In the previous year, the CSOs used up nearly all available funds from the EU pre-accession funds in the total amount of over 9 million euros. Round tables organized on that occasion featured discussions on various important issues, such as the importance of using EU funds to raise awareness of social inclusion, encouraging the development of volunteering, the importance of making amendments to the Right to Access Information



Presentation of the results of the study on Models of Good Governance in Civil Society Organizations in the Field of Democratization and Human Rights



The concept of the 2009 Annual Report received positive feedback from public authorities, CSOs, and grantmakers, which is why the National Foundation decided to apply the same concept in the 2010 Annual Report.

Act as a contribution to combating corruption, sustainable development of Croatian islands and coast with the preservation of biological diversity, environmental protection, and promoting human rights in Croatia.

The National Foundation for Civil Society Development and DIM Association for Civic Education organized a presentation of the results of the research titled "Models of Good Management in CSOs Dealing with Democratization and Human Rights", with the financial support by the National Foundation. The results of the research were published in a study titled "Values in Practice – Management and Civil Society Activism for Democratization and Human Rights".

The study covers two key topics: overview of management practices of CSOs dealing with human rights and democratization, and CSOs as actors in the policy process, non-institutional education, and direct protection of human rights.

The second topic encompassed various case studies of individual CSOs that have significant experience and achievements in advocacy activities especially in the area of legislation and public awareness on social services provision, such as free legal aid and non-formal education.

Croatian Parliament Accepted the 2009 Annual Report on the Activities of the National Foundation

On 12 July 2010, with a majority of votes the Croatian Parliament accepted the Annual Report on the activities of the National Foundation for 2009.

All parliamentary clubs supported the Report emphasizing the fact that the National Foundation made a significant contribution to the development of volunteering and philanthropy, and promotion of civil society development.

The 2009 Annual Report introduced a few novelties with regard to content, such as:

1. The statistics showing a parallel overview of the total number of citizens by county with the number of registered CSOs in relation to the number of approved grants by the National Foundation and the total amounts approved for their implementation;
2. An overview of the most frequent reasons for rejection of applications in tenders published by the National Foundation, with an overview of activities undertaken in order to decrease this number.

Donors and Foundations Conference

In cooperation with the British Council and US Embassy in Croatia, the National Foundation organized the 2nd Conference of the Foundations and Donors Forum held from 30 September to 2 October 2010 in IMPACT – European Centre for Cross-sector Partnership in Zadar.

The Conference was a continuation of the 1st National Conference of Grantmakers and Donors held in Dubrovnik in 2008, where a non-formal forum of foundations and donors was also founded – *Forum Za Dobro.BIT!*

The conference hosted several distinguished Croatian and international experts as lecturers, such as: Dr Christopher M. Harris, an international expert for philanthropy from USA; John Bromley (The National Social Marketing Centre) from Great Britain; Philip Tulba from British Young Foundation; Prof. Nenad Prelog, PhD – Professor at the Faculty of Political Science in Zagreb,



and at the University of Zadar; Marina Buza-Vidas, from the Croatian Government's Office for Cooperation with NGOs.

60 participants attended the conference, among who were representatives of foundations registered in Croatia, representatives of public administration bodies, and representatives of local and regional self-government.

E-bulletin *Civilno drustvo.eu* (Civil society.eu)

In 2010, the National Foundation continued, for the fourth year in a row, publishing news about civil society in the European Union on its website.

The aim of this continuous provision of information is to help prepare Croatian CSOs for the future environment in which they will carry out their activities. In that way the national public had the opportunity to follow up on the activities of European CSOs in the area of human rights, women's rights, rights of persons with disabilities, LGBTQ persons, persons in need, children and young people, environment, consumers' rights, animal rights protection, as well as any other news from EU institutions concerning civil society.

Summaries of select news about EU civil society are disseminated via e-mail to the list of the National Foundation's e-mail recipients every two weeks.

E-newspaper *Civilno društvo* (Civil society)

With the purpose of providing timely information to CSOs and the general public, in 2010 the National Foundation started publishing the electronic newspaper *Civilno društvo* (Civil Society). This electronic newspaper represents a kind of continuation of the professional journal *Civilno društvo* published from 2004 to 2009.

The reasons for initiating an electronic newspaper are the following: the paper edition of the magazine temporarily stopped being published due to necessary budget restructuring caused by reduced revenues, and the sudden development of other media in that period demanded faster, more available and more frequent informing.

Having in mind the need that exists in the general public for this kind of information related to civil society activities in Croatia, the National Foundation decided to initiate an informative version of e-bulletin *Civil society.eu* and provide information concerning civil society in Croatia through the same type of media.

With this new method of publishing new information, the public has the opportunity every two weeks to familiarize themselves with current issues related to civil initiatives, campaigns, attitudes and interviews, reactions, media projects, project overviews, conferences, and public events organized by CSOs.

The number of persons receiving the National Foundation's e-mails expanded in 2010 and included public policy makers, other grantmakers, donors, journalists, CSOs on local and regional levels, local authority bodies and the *interested public*.

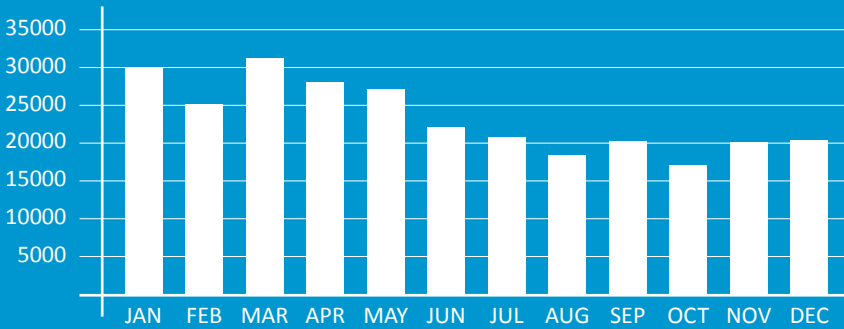
